



REIGN FC FALLS TO PORTLAND THORNS FC 4-2 AT PROVIDENCE PARK

Forward Emeri Adames and club original Jess Fishlock score for Seattle; Reign FC moves into sixth place in the NWSL standings, maintaining playoff position

PORTLAND, ORE. (August 10, 2025) – Seattle Reign FC (7-5-3, 24 points) fell 4-2 in a blistering match against Portland Thorns FC (4-7-4, 25 points) on Sunday afternoon at Providence Park. Though the Reign scored first, the Thorns mounted a comeback on their home turf.

Adames opened the scoring just three minutes in, as Fishlock scoped out her perfectly timed run behind Portland's backline. Displaying the poise of a veteran, the 19-year-old bypassed Mackenzie Arnold with her touch to the far post.

Portland answered back just 13 minutes later, as they were awarded a penalty kick and captain Sam Coffey slotted the ball cleanly to the left side of the goal. Momentum shifted in favor of the home side, and they soon took the lead as Jessie Fleming, who was stationed outside the 18-yard box, cleaned up a corner kick. She found the feet of Reilyn Turner, who took one touch before finding the back of the net in the 26th minute.

After halftime, Portland continued to press high, breaking through for another goal in the 55th minute. Olivia Moultrie's deflected shot fell to the head of Reyna Reyes, who was in position to score. The Reign added a second goal in the 64th minute, when Madison Curry looped a ball to the back post. Fishlock successfully dove to get her head on the end of it and direct the ball into the back of the net, but Seattle's chance at a comeback was all but thwarted when Portland immediately responded, netting the final goal of the match just one minute later.

Seattle returns home to face Chicago Stars FC on Monday, August 18 (7:00 p.m. PT / CBS Sports Network).

MATCH NOTES

- **EMERI ADAMES:** Emeri Adames scored her fifth goal of the season, the sixth of her career. The second-year forward continues to lead all Reign players in scoring and now ranks fifth in the NWSL for goals alongside Penelope Hocking (Bay FC), Bia Zaneratto (Kansas City Current), Gift Monday (Washington Spirit), Alyssa Thompson (Angel City FC), Debinha (Kansas City Current) and Reilyn Turner (Portland Thorns FC).
- **MADISON CURRY:** Madison Curry recorded her first assist of the season in the 64th minute on Jess Fishlock's goal. This marks Curry's second career assist.



- **CLAUDIA DICKEY:** Claudia Dickey set a new season-high saves in a single match (7) in back-to-back weeks. The 25-year-old now has 130 saves across four NWSL seasons.
- **JESS FISHLOCK:** Jess Fishlock has scored in two consecutive games with her goal today, in addition to her assist on Adames' goal in the third minute. The assist was her second of the season, and her 30th career assist. Her goal marks her third of the season and the fourth time in the 2025 campaign that a Reign player has recorded at least one goal and one assist. The veteran midfielder now has 45 career regular-season goals, the 11th-most in NWSL history.
- **SERIES:** With today's result, Reign FC holds a record of 16-17-10 against Portland Thorns FC across all NWSL competitions.
- **UP NEXT:** Reign FC (7-5-3, 24 points) will be back home at Lumen Field to play Chicago Stars FC (1-9-5, 8 points) on Monday, August 18 (7:00 p.m. PT / CBS Sports Network).
