MATCH PREVIEW

HERRIMAN, Utah (Thursday, October 16, 2025) – Utah Royals FC (5-12-7, 22 points, 12th NWSL) head to Washington to take on Seattle Reign FC (9-7-8, 35 points, 8th NWSL) on Friday, October 17. Kickoff is scheduled for 8:00 p.m. MT.

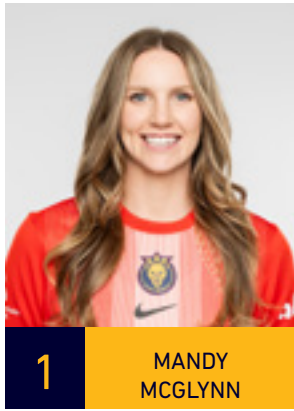
Utah Royals FC is coming off a 3-2 home loss to San Diego Wave FC. The match, played under heavy rain in the first half and delayed due to lightning in the area, marked the first defeat for Utah in an impressive 64 days. Utah opened the scoring in the 9th minute through Danish international Janni Thomsen, who recorded a third NWSL goal—each one coming after the summer break. The curling left-footed strike from outside the 18-yard box earned a Goal of the Week nomination. San Diego equalized in the 29th minute and took the lead just before halftime in the 45+1' minute, courtesy of an own goal. Mina Tanaka once again found the back of the net, pulling Utah level in the 54th minute with a third goal in two matches. Utah conceded an unfortunate goal in the 72nd minute and was unable to find an equalizer in the remaining 18 minutes of play. The loss eliminated Utah from playoff contention.

Utah has won one, drawn one, and lost two matches against Seattle Reign FC since returning in 2024 across all competitions. In 2024, both teams played to a 1-1 draw in Seattle. Just 12 days later, Utah returned to Seattle and fell 2-1 in the NWSL x Liga MX Femenil Summer Cup. Seattle then visited Utah on October 13, falling 3-0 after a first-half **Cloé Lacasse** hat trick — the first one of the 2024 NWSL season. In 2025, Seattle visited Utah on June 21 and handed Utah a 4-1 loss, with **Bianca St-Georges** scoring Utah's lone goal.

Seattle Reign FC enters Friday's matchup in 5th place on the NWSL table heading into Week 25. Seattle has recorded two wins, two draws, and one loss in its last five matches. Most recently, Seattle drew with both Bay FC and Gotham FC. Before that, they defeated the North Carolina Courage 2-1, then suffered a 2-0 road loss against the Kansas City Current. Prior to that, the Reign earned a crucial home victory over Racing Louisville in a key playoff race matchup.

Following Friday night's match, Utah return home for the regular season finale against the Washington Spirit on November 2. Kickoff time is to be announced. Tickets are available at <https://www.rsl.com/utahroyals/tickets/single>.

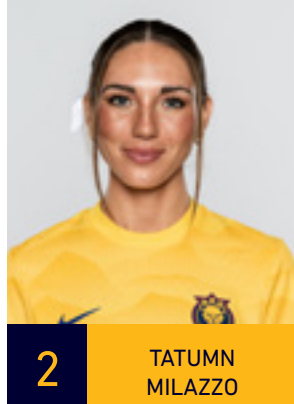

McGlynn started as a goalkeeper in all four years that she attended Virginia Tech and went back-to-back as the All-ACC First Team goalkeeper. Drafted in 2020 by Sky Blue FC (Gotham FC), spent one year in New York before moving overseas to Piteå IF in the Swedish first division. McGlynn spent the 2022 season in Sweden's top league, where she was named Norbotten's Female Player of the Year after starting every game, recording seven shutouts, and becoming one of only three players in the league to play every single minute. She returned to Gotham FC in 2023, winning the NWSL Championship before moving to the Wasatch Front. In her lone season with URFC set the club record for single-season saves with 84 in 24 appearances. The strong performance led her to be named club MVP leading to her first senior team call up and debut in a 3-0 win over Argentina last October.

Prior to joining the NWSL, Milazzo played four years at the University of South Carolina, winning Southeastern Conference titles in 2016, 2017, and 2019 with the Gamecocks. Milazzo joined the Chicago Stars' 2021 preseason squad, eventually moving up to the supplemental roster two months later, on April 5. Four days later, Milazzo made her professional debut in an NWSL Challenge Cup match, subbing in during the 87th minute of a 0-0 draw. Milazzo leaves Chicago Stars FC with 70 career NWSL appearances, including Challenge Cup and NWSL playoff matches, along with four career goals, 171 career tackles, and 115 career interceptions. Now picked up in free agency, the speedy 26-year-old will look to leave her mark on the upward-trending URFC side.

Monaghan, a New Jersey native, attended Butler University for four years, playing in 80 matches and recording 22 goals and 18 assists. She was named twice to the All-Big East First Team, Second Team All-American, All-American Scholar and also earned 2017 All-Big East Player of the Year plaudits. The forward made Butler history when she was drafted 10th overall in the 2019 NWSL Draft by Gotham FC where she played 57 games across four years. In 2023, she headed south to Racing Louisville and appeared in 22 games before making the move to Utah with nine professional goals to her name. URFC's inaugural captain appeared in 22 matches last season notching two goals and one assist in 1578 regular season minutes.

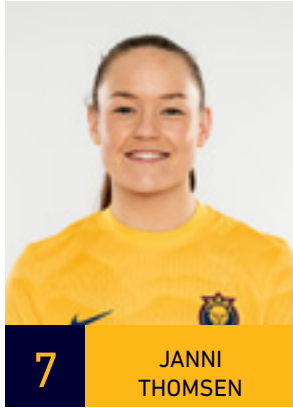

Flynn was the 16th overall pick in the 2023 NWSL Draft landing FSU their second draftee of the night. Flynn played in 79 games while making 70 starts for the Seminoles over the course of her career. A two-time NCAA Champion, Flynn ended her career with seven goals and three assists, five of those goals which came in 2023. While at FSU, she also helped the Seminoles to four straight ACC Championships. Making her professional debut on April 20 against Louisville starting at right back, Flynn logged a full 90 and did not look back making nine consecutive starts after her debut. The bruising defender who received three yellow cards in 2024 had her rookie campaign cut short after being diagnosed with bilateral compartment syndrome in her lower legs. Flynn anticipates a full return for the 2025 season.

Thomsen, 25, brings Champions League experience to a young URFC roster. After five years of service at Vålerenga, logging 100 appearances (seven in Champions League), 8,103 minutes, 14 goals, and 25 assists Thomsen's chapter in the Toppserien ended with back-to-back league titles. Since making her senior team debut with Denmark in 2020 Thomsen has notched 42 caps, most recently leading Denmark to a 2025 EURO Qualification finishing second in Group 2 with 12 points behind the reigning EURO Champs Spain.

One of two players returning to Utah from the Club's first iteration, Del Fava was born in Evanston, IL. Her college career took her south to Illinois State, where she played all four years, gathering a wealth of personal accolades including 2019 MVC Player of the Year, three All-MVC First Team awards and six MVC player of the week awards among others. She was drafted by Utah Royals FC in 2020 with the 12th overall pick and made her debut in the 2020 Challenge Cup. When the first version of URFC folded, she moved with the Club to Kansas City for two years where she scored her first professional goal. Iron Woman played every minute of URFC's inaugural season en route to earning team DPOY. Del Fava notched her first two professional-goals last season that included game winners against North Carolina Courage and expansion sibling Bay FC.

In August 2016, Prašnikar signed with Turbine Potsdam, where she notched 31 goals in 65 matches across domestic competitions. Her consistent scoring form earned her a move to Eintracht Frankfurt in 2020, where she became one of the league's most reliable attacking threats. She was recognized for her performances on multiple occasions, being named Slovenian Women's Footballer of the Year in 2022, 2023, and 2024. Prašnikar led her country and all 2025 Euros Qualifiers goal scorers, finding the back of the net 9 times in 8 matches. Following a successful individual campaign with the national team she brought her international tally to 48 goals and in 88 senior appearances.

Zornoza joins Utah Royals FC after playing her final season with Real Madrid. In Zornoza's final season overseas, she logged 28 matches and 1784 minutes contributing four goals and four assists en route to a second place finish in Liga F behind juggernauts FC Barcelona Femení. Zornoza also appeared in Real Madrid's six group stage matches in the UEFA Women's Champions League. Zornoza has represented Spain in a number of international matches and tournaments. Zornoza appeared for La Roja in last year's edition of the FIFA World Cup where Spain ended up as World Champions. After 10 matches with URFC the Spanish midfielder opened up midfield notching three assists alongside providing lethal blows behind a dead ball, scoring a PK and Free Kick last season.

Mina Tanaka joins Utah Royals FC from Kobe Leonessa of Japan's WE League where she played 58 matches and scored 37 goals. She comes to the Beehive state after playing 13 seasons in Japan, appearing for Tokyo Verdy Beleza from 2011-2019 and INAC Kobe Leonessa from 2020-2024 with a ten match stint on loan in Germany's Frauen-Bundesliga with Bayer Leverkusen in 2020. She has appeared in 4 major international tournaments for Japan. Tanaka has an eye for goal, winning the Nadeshiko golden boot title four times (2016, 2017, 2018, 2019). She was also named to Nadeshiko League Best XI five times (2015, 2016, 2017), and won back-to-back Nadeshiko League Best Player Awards in 2018 and 2019. Representing club and country, Tanaka has found the back of the net 211 times in 308 total club appearances as well as 30 goals in 74 senior international appearances. Tanaka's presence was felt immediately upon arrival bringing an attacking poise scoring one goal in seven matches.

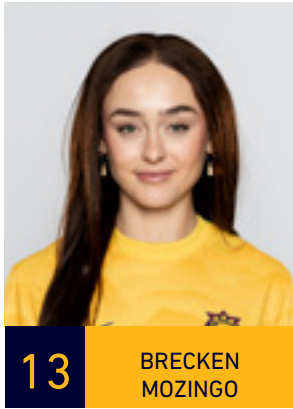

Mozingo was drafted 4th overall at the 2023 NWSL Draft where she was part of an historic night for BYU as one of a program-record five players selected. The Utah native logged nearly 1000 minutes in her rookie campaign appearing in 18 regular season matches. Mozingo made a name for herself in the professional realm during the inaugural NWSL x Liga MX Femenil Summer cup tournament with a brace against Club Tijuana, the club's first brace of the 2024 calendar year.

The Spaniard hails from VfL Wolfsburg where she logged 12 appearances, including six starts during both Bundesliga sanctioned matches and UEFA Champions League matches. Robano started her career at Deportivo la Coruña and was a part of the undefeated 2018-2019 season that promoted them to the Primera División for the first time in its history. In 2020 Rábano transferred to Real Sociedad and made 57 appearances before her transfer to FC Barcelona. While at FC Barcelona Rábano was a part of the 2022-23 season win of the Primera División. Rábano has one cap with the Spain women's national team in 2022 and logged 16 minutes of play time in the 1-1 draw against Sweden.

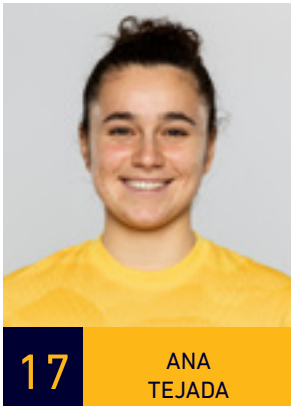

In addition to her football accomplishments, she lettered four times in soccer before moving to Central Michigan University. Pogarch transferred to Rutgers for her senior year where she was named third team All-Big-10. She was picked up by Portland Thorns in 2019 after playing for two different semi-pro teams in Michigan. After four years in Portland, the speedy fullback made the move to San Diego Wave and had the best season of her career, helping the Wave win the 2023 NWSL Shield. A URFC backline regular, Pogarch notched 25 matches this season and 1884 minutes on the pitch, Pogarch's vocal leadership can be easily recognized.

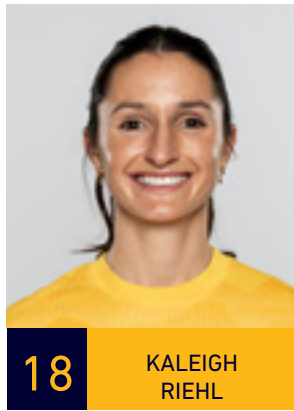

Ana Tejada, born and raised in Logroño, Spain she joins Utah Royals with a wealth of club and international experience. Tejada started her professional club career at the age of 17 with Real Sociedad in Liga F in Spain. She would become a mainstay in the team by the 2020-21 season earning 24 starts. She has also played with Spain's youth national teams winning the Euro's and the World Cup with the U-17's and also winning the World Cup with the U-20 team. The center back also has 1 cap with the senior national team. She leaves Real Sociedad having made 86 appearances and scoring 1 goal. Joining URFC as a defender Tejada quickly moved into the midfield pairing with Spaniard Zornoza. Tejada became a threat from distance along with the rest of the URFC midfield after scoring rips from deep against Houston and the game winner at home against Louisville. Good form earned Tejada her first call up to La Roja senior team since 2022.

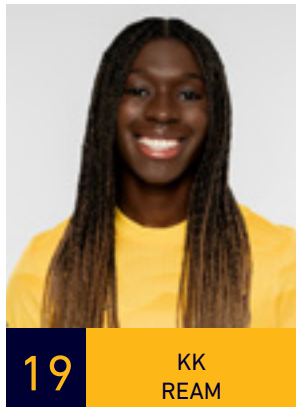

Riehl plied her trade at Penn State logging 8,847 minutes, an All-Time NCAA record. She was then drafted 11th overall by Sky Blue FC in 2020 and was sent on loan to Paris FC where she recorded 8 appearances. Upon arriving back in the states, she moved to Racing Louisville FC by way of the Expansion Draft in 2021. Riehl would move the next year to San Diego Wave FC, and then finally to Utah Royals FC in 2023. Riehl helped headline one of the league's best defenses which gave up the second least amount of goals during the 2023 NWSL Regular Season (22) and the least amount of expected goals against (23.6). In her premier season with URFC Riehl made 14 appearances on the back line. Completing 90% of her passes and recording one assist Riehl provided the Royals with an underrated offensive presence building out of the back.

She arrives on the Wasatch Front following a season in Denmark's top division with AaB Kvinde Elitefodbold. In her first professional campaign, Boyan made 14 appearances—all of them starts—playing all but 15 minutes across those matches. She recorded two goals and one assist during her time in Denmark. A standout at the University of Georgia, Boyan played in 93 matches for the Bulldogs, starting every game. Over five seasons, she tallied 17 goals and 18 assists while logging 7,896 career minutes. Her collegiate accolades include First Team All-SEC honors in 2020 and 2022, and Second Team All-SEC in 2021.

STORYLINES

IRONWOMAN KATE

Center back Kate Del Fava completed the incredible feat of being one of only four outfield players throughout the NWSL to play every minute of URFC's regular-season campaign. Her first Ironwoman season not only showcased her stamina and consistency but also her impact on the field, as she contributed two goals and one assist. A vital presence in the defensive line, Del Fava's leadership and tenacity helped anchor Utah Royals FC through a challenging season. Her unwavering commitment to the team's success was especially evident in the final stretch of the year, where her resilience and clutch performances made her an integral part of its push for the playoffs. Whether stopping attacks or creating opportunities, Del Fava's relentless work ethic made her a key figure in Utah's defensive and offensive schemes.

INTERNATIONAL PRESENCE

Utah Royals FC boasts an impressive international roster, with players representing nine different nations. The United States is well-represented by a few players, including Mandy McGlynn, who plays with the senior squad, and KK Ream, who has earned various international call-ups to youth teams. Canada is represented by Cloé Lacasse and Bianca St-Georges, with Lacasse also having represented her nation at the 2024 Paris Olympics and the 2023 FIFA Women's World Cup. Together, these North American players bring a wealth of talent and experience to the Royals.

The team's Latin American representation is strong with Guatemala's Aisha Solorzano. Solorzano brings valuable experience to the squad.

In the Asia-Pacific region, New Zealand's Macey Fraser was part of the squad for the 2024 Paris Olympics, while Japan's Mina Tanaka, a key player for the Royals, also represented her country at the showpiece event. These two international talents bring speed, skill, and resilience to Utah's roster.

Finally, Spain is represented by Nuria Rabano, Ana Tejada, and Claudia Zornoza, while the Netherlands' Dana Foederer completes the international mix. These European players add depth and versatility to Utah's lineup, with their experience across top international competitions further strengthening the squad.

NEW FACES

URFC Sporting Director Kelly Cousins and Assistant Sporting Director Connor Oniki went to work over the offseason bringing in talent from all over the globe in hopes of a playoff run this upcoming season. Assistant Coach Emily Simpkins makes the move across the pond from Birmingham City Women after one year as an assistant and 17 years lacing up the boots. Player-wise, URFC beefed up its depth adding veteran defenders Alex Loera from expansion sibling Bay FC and Tatum Milazzo from Chicago Stars. URFC invested in its future by signing U-16 USYNT regular KK Ream, an RSL-Arizona academy product. Rounding out the 2025 off-season class the Blue-and-Gold acquired Aisha Solórzano, a lethal goal scorer from Club Tijuana to bolster its loaded attacking room.

SPIRIT OF BRAVERY AND THRILL-SEEKING: A NEW CULTURAL FOUNDATION

Head Coach Coenraets laid down the marker in relation to the kind of culture the club aims to build around the team, citing the need for "naturally adventurous, thrill-seeking players" as a means of aiding and informing the kind of positive, attacking football the Belgian aims to continue to implement.

The Royals have adopted a transfer strategy to fit the mold with the winter acquisitions of striker Aisha Solórzano alongside creative fullbacks Nuria Rabano and Ana Guzman, veteran defender Tatum Milazzo, and midfielder Alex Loera, all reflecting its new intended cultural philosophy.

In continuance to 2024, Coenraets aims to administer a progressively positive, high-risk system crucially through the use of players who are also naturally adventurous in their approach and expression of themselves in regard to football and are not shy or afraid to take risks whenever possible.



STORYLINES

BY COMMITTEE

URFC scored by committee in its inaugural 2024 NWSL season as 11 players found the net during regular-season play, Cloé Lacasse led the way with four goals. Utah Royals forwards returning from last season (Paige Monaghan, Brecken Mazingo, Mina Tanaka, and Lacasse) combined for 6.5 xG (excluding Lacasse, who will miss at least the first half of the season) in 3056 minutes on the pitch, averaging 0.19 xG per 90. Not only can the Royals attackers in this squad score, but URFC's midfield group can also cause havoc, especially from distance. 2024 midfield end-of-season starters Ally Sentnor, Claudia Zornoza, and Ana Tejada combined for seven goals throughout the season scoring all but two from outside the penalty area. Scoring 24 goals across all competitions, URFC hit its stride after head coach Jimmy Coenraets took over the reins, in July, expect the goal-scoring to start early in the club's sophomore season.

FIRST FULL SEASON WITH JIMMY COENRAETS AT THE HELM

As the Utah Royals prepare for its second season since the return of royalty in 2024, head coach Jimmy Coenraets is also set to take charge of his first full term at the helm of URFC.

The Belgian tactician arrived at URFC in June 2024, initially joining as an assistant coach before being promoted to an interim head coach position in July following a club reorganization.

Coenraets joined the Utah Royals from Belgian WSL side OH Leuven where he spent a total of five seasons, developing a reputation as one of the best young and rising coaches in women's football. During his time with OHL, the 29-year-old amassed an impressive record of 77 wins, 26 draws, and only 12 losses in his 115 games in charge, the successes of which subsequently led to him being named the Belgium Pro League Manager of the Year at the end of the 2021-2022 campaign, adding to what was already a burgeoning reputation.

Throughout the final half of the 2024 NWSL campaign under Coenraets' leadership, the Royals emerged as one of the most in-form sides in the top division, and in October, the Belgian was handed a promotion to be the team's permanent head coach, signing a permanent contract through to the 2027 season.

RETURNING PLAYERS FROM INJURY

The Royals' 2025 season will also be significantly boosted by the return of several stars from injury. Fullback Imani Dorsey perhaps headlines the returning players, having recovered from a long-term injury.

The former Gotham FC defender signed for the Utah Royals at the end of the 2023 NWSL season, ahead of the Club's much-celebrated return to the Wasatch Front, before suffering a ruptured Achilles tendon on March 22, which ruled her out for the rest of the year.

New Zealand international Macey Fraser is also featured on the list, having returned from an ankle injury suffered on international duty with the Football Ferns at the Summer 2024 Women's Olympics football tournament in Paris.

Captain Paige Monaghan is also expected to be available for selection at the start of the season after recovering from a right hip injury suffered near the end of 2024.



STORYLINES

CONTINUING MOMENTUM FROM LAST SEASON

Head Coach Coenraets' arrival ignited something of a renaissance around the club, with the team experiencing a marked resurgence in form, performances, and, consequently, results between the middle and conclusion of the 2024 season.

Upon the Belgian's temporary appointment in July, URFC enjoyed an immediate positive run of four wins in his first six matches in charge, including two wins in three games in the summer's NWSL x Liga MX Femenil Summer Cup, which culminated in a second-place Group Stage finish.

In domestic competition following his arrival, the Royals tripled their total points accrued during the second half of the season, compared to the first, recording five wins, two draws, and three defeats in its final 10 NWSL games which sparked a late push for a postseason spot and propelled the team from the bottom of the league to within only four points of the playoff line by the year's end.

During that time, the team also embarked on an impressive four-game unbeaten run which encompassed an impressive 3-0 home victory against the Seattle Reign where forward Cloe Lacasse became the first, and currently only, URFC player to score a hat trick for the club in an NWSL game.

TACTICAL BLUEPRINT

As part of a sweeping set of changes made upon his arrival, Coenraets also implemented a plethora of bespoke tactical tweaks administered with the intention of raising the technical base of the playing squad at his disposal and getting his players to play at their best, fullest potential.

In summary, Coenraets' coaching philosophy emphasizes player development both on and off the pitch by creating and fostering a positive, productive team environment conducive to player growth and success.

During the latter half of the 2024 season, URFC typically set out a 4-2-3-1 starting base formation, with dynamic attacking full-backs complemented by inverted wingers capable of operating in wider zones but more frequently moving infield and operating in the channels. A dependable double pivot both capable with the ball at their feet was also an important feature of Coenraets' system, with the pair crucially responsible for linking the team's defense to attack and supporting attacking moves whilst also requiring the defensive nous to effectively shield and provide cover for their defenders when needed.

Such compelling adjustments, combined with the new player arrivals during the middle of the season, all conspired to help create a strong tactical and technical foundation upon which most of the team's successes during the second half of the season were laid.

GOALKEEPER ROOM

The "Goalkeeping Room" at Utah Royals FC is anchored by Mandy McGlynn, a standout shot-stopper who is making her case to be the starting goalkeeper for the United States Women's National Team. With her growing international experience and consistent performances, McGlynn brings stability and leadership to the position. Mia Justus, most recently called up to the USWNT Futures Camp, is an exciting young talent with a bright future ahead.

The group is expertly guided by James White, a UEFA A License Goalkeeping Coach with extensive experience in both English and international football. White, who played professionally for Southampton and is currently the U-19 England Women's goalkeeping coach, brings a wealth of knowledge and expertise to the Royals' backroom staff. His leadership ensures that Utah's goalkeepers are constantly developing, making the "Goalkeeping Room" a crucial part of the team's success.





Head Coach Jimmy Coenraets

Coenraets brings head coach experience to the staff as he most recently held the women's manager position at OH Leuven in Belgium. The Brusselleers assistant holds a degree in marketing and international football business from the University of Brussels along with a A coaching license.

Bringing nearly a decade of women's soccer experience to the youngest roster in the NWSL, Coenraets entered the professional realm in 2016. When Coenraets took over his previous club in 2020, they ranked last in the league. In Coenraets second season as manager he turned OH Leuven to a title contender & was named Belgium Pro League manager of the year.

Assistant Coach Mariana Cabral



Cabral, former Sporting Clube de Portugal head coach, joins Coenraets as first assistant. The former footballer turned journalist dropped the pen and picked up the whistle in 2021 starting her coaching career. Cabral ended her time with Sporting Clube de Portugal finishing second in the league for two consecutive years,

Assistant Coach Emily Simpkins



Simpkins joins URFC after one year as an assistant coach at Birmingham City Women, where she spent three years as a player between 2012 and 2015. Prior to coaching, Simpkins was a former footballer appearing for various clubs throughout England. The attacker started her senior playing career in 2007 for Nottingham Forest, but signed her first professional deal in 2015 with Doncaster Belles.

Goalkeeper Coach James White



White is a UEFA A License Goalkeeping Coach with extensive experience in both English and international football. White's journey in football began during his playing days as a goalkeeper for Southampton Football Club in the Premier League, the highest division of English football. White returned to Southampton in 2019 where he worked as the club's goalkeeping coach
