



REIGN FC SETTLES FOR 3-3 DRAW AGAINST CHICAGO STARS FC AT LUMEN FIELD MONDAY NIGHT

For the first time in club history, Reign FC scores multiple goals in six consecutive matches; Chicago rallies from three goals down to earn a point

SEATTLE, WASH. (August 18, 2025) – Seattle Reign FC (7-5-4, 25 points) and Chicago Stars FC (1-9-6, 9 points) played to a 3-3 draw in The Queen’s Match on Monday night at Lumen Field.

Seattle struck quickly for the second straight match, opening the scoring in the third minute. Forward Jordyn Huitema chased down the ball and delivered a cross into the six-yard box, where veteran midfielder Jess Fishlock redirected it cleanly into the net. The Reign doubled their lead in the 34th minute after Madison Curry’s rebound attempt rattled off the crossbar, setting up Huitema for a perfectly timed bicycle kick finish from the center of the box.

Carrying momentum into the second half, Seattle extended the lead in the 46th minute when team-leading scorer Emeri Adames tapped in her sixth goal of the season on an open net, putting the Reign up 3-0. Chicago mounted its comeback within the final 20 minutes of the match. Forward Ludmila, the Stars’ leading scorer, pulled one back in the 73rd minute, before defender Camryn Biegalski added another just five minutes later. Deep into stoppage time, goalkeeper Alyssa Naehar completed the rally with a dramatic equalizer, sealing the 3-3 draw.

Seattle now heads on the road to face the Houston Dash on Sunday, August 24 (4:00 p.m. PT / NWSL+, Paramount+).

MATCH NOTES

- **GOALS AND ASSISTS:** Reign FC now has four different players who have recorded both a goal and an assist in a single game this season – Maddie Dahlien, Jess Fishlock, Jordyn Huitema and Ji So-Yun. The only other NWSL club with at least four such players in 2025 is the Kansas City Current.
- **MULTIPLE GOALS:** For the first time in club history, Reign FC has scored multiple goals in six consecutive matches. Previously, the longest streak was five straight matches, achieved three times (twice in 2014 and once in 2015), both during the Shield-winning seasons.
- **EMERI ADAMES:** Emeri Adames struck just seconds into the second half, scoring in the 46th minute for Seattle’s third goal of the night. The 19-year-old attacker now has five goals in her last six matches and leads the team with six goals this season. Adames’ six goals in 2025 tie the NWSL single-season record for the most goals by a teenager, joining Sam Kerr (2013), Mallory Swanson (2017), Trinity Rodman



(2021) and Jaedyn Shaw (2023).

- **JESS FISHLOCK:** Club original Jess Fishlock opened the scoring in the third minute, her fourth goal of the season and 46th of her NWSL career. The Welsh midfielder has now contributed to a goal in four consecutive appearances, the longest streak by a Reign player since Megan Rapinoe's run of seven straight in 2022. Against the Stars, Fishlock has scored a head-to-head best eight goals and contributed to 11 overall across all competitions.
- **JORDYN HUITEMA:** Jordyn Huitema assisted Fishlock's opener in the third minute before doubling the lead with a goal of her own in the 34th. This is the second time in her NWSL career that Huitema has recorded both a goal and an assist in the same match.
- **SERIES:** With tonight's result, Reign FC holds a record of 11-12-10 against Chicago Stars FC across all NWSL competitions.
- **UP NEXT:** Reign FC (7-5-4, 25 points) is back on the road to face the Houston Dash (5-8-3, 18 points) at Shell Energy Stadium on Sunday, August 24 (4:00 p.m. PT / NWSL+, Paramount+).
