### CURRENTLY

- The Current's 50 points are the most any team has collected through 20 matches of a season in NWSL history. Last weekend, the club became the fastest team to reach 50 in league history.
- Kansas City is riding a 13-match unbeaten streak, equaling the fourth longest single-season streak in NWSL history. It's the Current's third unbeaten run of 13+ games in a single season (2022, 2024), something all other teams in NWSL history have combined to do only twice (2024 Orlando, 2014 Seattle).
- The Current has faced 9.1 shots per match with an expected goals value of 4.56 (0.57 per match) over their last eight games, not allowing any team to record an xG of 1.0 or better in any match. The Current is winning by an average of 1.4 goals per match (+28 in 20 matches) in 2025, with only 2018 North Carolina (+1.5, +36 goals in 24 games) doing better over a full season.
- A clean sheet would set a new NWSL single-season record for most team shutouts with 14. KC co-owns the record of 13 with 2021 Portland and 2024 Orlando. A shutout would also extend KC's league record streak to nine straight.
- If ironwoman Kayla Sharples starts, she will set a new club record for consecutive regular season starts with 29. She has started every regular season match since her KC debut on Sept. 7, 2024. Lo LaBonta and Hailie Mace co-own the club record with 28.
- Kansas City's last loss was to Seattle, 141 days ago. The Current trailed for 60:10 of real time against the Reign after conceding a first-half goal, while they've been behind for a total of 5 minutes, 4 seconds combined in their other 19 games this season.

**PLAYERS TO WATCH ...** For Kansas City, defender **Kayla Sharples** – Through Week 20, nine players across the league have played every minute of the regular season, including Sharples. Her active streak of 1,800 regular season minutes ranks second in club history. Sharples, who has started every regular season match since her KC Current debut in September 2024, is one off from setting a new club record with 29 consecutive regular season starts. Sharples is in the conversation for NWSL Defender of the Year, and for good reason: She has been instrumental in the Current's league-leading 13 shutouts, eight straight shutouts, and league-record 722 minutes without conceding.

For Seattle, forward **Jordyn Huitema** – Huitema has scored three goals against Kansas City in her NWSL career, including scoring her lone career brace in the Reign's visit to CPKC Stadium in June 2024. Huitema is the only visiting player to score multiple goals in a competitive match at CPKC Stadium since Sophia Wilson and Janine Sonis did so for Portland in the stadium's inaugural game in March 2024. Huitema has played in 17 matches for the Reign this season with 14 starts, totaling three goals and one assist.

**LAST TIME OUT ...** The Kansas City Current played the Washington Spirit to a scoreless draw on Sept. 13 at CPKC Stadium. The Current remains the only team in the league that's unbeaten at home this year.

Last match notables:

- Kansas City earned its eighth consecutive shutout and extended its franchise and NWSL record for consecutive regular season shutout minutes with 722.
- The Current equaled the NWSL record for most shutouts in a single season with 13 (tied with 2021 POR and 2024 ORL).
- The Current became the fastest team in NWSL history to reach 50 points, doing so in just 50 games.
- **Vlatko Andonovski** is the first NWSL coach to record multiple seasons with 50+ points.
- **Kayla Sharples** made her 28th consecutive regular season start to tie the club record.
- **Alex Pfeiffer** made her first regular season appearance in 442 days.

**HOME SWEET HOME ...** The Current has played 31 matches across all competitions (regular season, post-season, NWSL x Liga MX Femenil Summer Cup, The Women's Cup, Teal Rising Cup) at CPKC Stadium – the world's first stadium purpose-built for women's professional sports – since its opening on March 16, 2024. The club boasts an impressive 25-1-5 ledger all-time at CPKC Stadium across all competitions.

In the regular season, KC Current owns a 16-1-5 record across 22 regular season home games, and has scored in all but two matches played at home. The Current has won 17 of its last 20 home matches across all competitions, having out-scored opponents 46-9 in that stretch.

The Current is the only team in the NWSL this year that remains unbeaten at home.

**Temwa Chawinga** has been involved in at least one goal in 16 of her 21 NWSL regular season matches at CPKC Stadium, totaling 21 goal contributions (17 goals, four assists). She has contributed to 25 goals (19 goals, six assists) in her 26 matches at CPKC Stadium across all competitions (she did not play in two home Summer Cup games in 2024, both Teal Rising Cup matches in 2025, or vs. Washington Spirit in the NWSL regular season). The 2024 NWSL MVP and Golden Boot winner has been directly involved in at least one goal in all but six of her 26 matches played in Kansas City across all competitions.

Additionally, the Current has played in 11 tournament games (NWSL Playoffs, NWSL x Liga MX Femenil Summer Cup, The Women's Cup, Teal Rising Cup) since head coach and sporting director **Vlatko Andonovski** took over ahead of the 2024 season. Across those 11 tournament games, Kansas City boasts an impressive 10-1-0 record, including an unblemished 9-0-0 mark for tournament games played at CPKC Stadium.

**THE SUMMER I CLINCHED A PLAYOFF SPOT ...** On Aug. 30 with a 2-0 win over the NC Courage at CPKC Stadium, the KC Current officially became the first team this year to punch its ticket to the 2025 NWSL Playoffs. Kansas City equaled Orlando's record from last year for the fastest team to

secure a playoff berth with eight regular season games remaining.

This marks the Current's third playoff appearance in franchise history, having now done so in back-to-back seasons. Kansas City advanced to the championship match in 2022 as the fifth seed, and advanced to the semifinals in 2024 as the fourth seed. The first-ever home playoff match in franchise history was in the 2024 NWSL Quarterfinals.

KC head coach **Vlatko Andonovski** has now reached the NWSL playoffs seven times in his career, equaling the league record held by Mark Parsons.

The following week, Kansas City's 2-0 win over Bay FC and Washington's 2-0 win over Seattle guaranteed the Current a top-4 playoff seed, which secured their spot for hosting a home quarterfinal match. It will be the second home playoff match in club and CPKC Stadium history.

On Sept. 13, the Current secured a top-2 seed for the NWSL Playoffs after their draw with the Spirit combined with the Thorns' draw. Kansas City will host a quarterfinal match and, should the team advance, a semifinal match.

**TOP OF THE TABLE ...** Kansas City remains at the top of the NWSL table for the 16th week in a row with 50 points behind a 16-2-2 record. Prior to April 21, the last time the club was No. 1 was June 2024 at the end of Week 15, a spot it held for one week.

Kansas City is the eighth team in NWSL history to record at least 15 wins in a single regular season. The Current became the fastest team to reach 15 regular season wins in a season, doing so in just 18 games. The most wins in a single regular season in league history is 18 (Orlando, 2024).

The Current's 50 points are the most any team has collected through 20 matches of a season in NWSL history (Seattle 2014 had 49 points). On Sept. 13, Kansas City became the fastest team in league history to hit 50 points, doing so in just 50 matches.

Entering Week 21, 14 points separate Kansas City (50 pts) from the next closest team, Washington Spirit (36 points). The Current has a plus-28 goal difference heading into Week 21; the next

closest team, Gotham FC, has a plus-10 goal difference. In fact, the Current's plus-28 goal differential is greater than the goal differential for all other teams in playoff position combined (plus-27).

Kansas City is 26-3-4 in its last 33 games across all competitions.

Additionally, the Current checked in at No. 4 on the latest Opta Power Rankings from Sept. 11. The Opta Power Rankings are a global team ranking system that assigns an ability score to over 2,000 women's football teams on a scale between 0-100. Kansas City's score was 93.8 – the next closest NWSL team, Gotham FC, was ranked 10th with a score of 89.0.

**SEATTLE CONNECTIONS ...** Goal-keeper Laurel Ivory joined the Kansas City Current in December 2024 from the Seattle Reign. Ivory signed with the Reign in 2022 following her collegiate career at the University of Virginia. She made her professional debut in May 2023 during the IKG NWSL Challenge Cup, starting against Angel City and earning her first clean sheet. She started four of six Challenge Cup games that year and earned a shutout in three of them. Her regular season debut came in 2024 with nine appearances and eight starts.

The Current acquired defender Alana Cook in a trade from the Seattle Reign in Summer 2024. She started her professional career with Paris Saint-Germain in 2019 before going on loan to OL Reign in 2020, a move that was made permanent in 2021. During her tenure in Seattle, Cook made 84 appearances and was named to the NWSL Best XI and a finalist for the NWSL Defender of the Year in 2021 and 2022.

Head coach Vlatko Andonovski also has Seattle ties. He was the head coach of Reign FC during the 2018 and 2019 seasons prior to taking over the helm of the U.S. Women's National Team. Following the conclusion of the Reign's 2019 season, he was tabbed the NWSL Coach of the Year. Andonovski succeeded Laura Harvey as Seattle's head coach; Harvey later returned to the club in 2021. Andonovski and Harvey are the two winningest coaches in league history.

**ON RECORD WATCH ...** A few NWSL records are within reach this season for

the KC Current:

- **Kayla Sharples** is one start away from setting a new club record for consecutive starts with 29. The record currently stands at 28, shared by Mace and LaBonta.
- Kansas City is one win away from setting a new club record for regular season wins in a single season. The club record currently stands at 16 from 2024.
- The next game-winning goal for **Temwa Chawinga** will set a new NWSL single season record of seven. She's currently tied with several players for the current record with six.
- Kansas City is three wins from equaling the NWSL record for most wins in a regular season. Orlando owns the record at 18 from 2024.
- **Lo LaBonta** is one regular season penalty from equaling Megan Rapinoe's NWSL record of 14. LaBonta is currently tied with Marta for second with 13.
- **Lorena** currently has been credited with 11 regular season shutouts. The NWSL record for regular season shutouts is 13 (ORL Anna Moorhouse, 2024).
- Kansas City has conceded only 10 goals. The NWSL single season record for least goals conceded in a regular season is 17, set by North Carolina in 2018 and matched by Portland in 2021.

**#TEMVP ... Temwa Chawinga**, the 2024 NWSL MVP and Golden Boot winner, ranks second in the 2025 NWSL Golden Boot race through Week 19 with 12 goals and two assists. She is one of five players who has notched at least eight goals this year, and was the second player to hit the 10-goal mark.

On Aug. 7, Chawinga was nominated for the Ballon d'Or, a prestigious annual honor for the player deemed to have performed the best over the previous season. It's the first such nomination of her career. She was also named the KC Sportswoman of the Year on Aug. 14 from the Kansas City Sports Commission.

Her six game-winning goals also lead the league. That ties her own NWSL regular season record for the second straight year, a mark she shares with Crystal Dunn (2015), Midge Purce (2021), Barbra Banda (2024). She has 12 career





regular season game-winning goals, a club record, which ties Lynn Bijendolo (NC), Debinha (NC) and Christen Press (CHI) for seventh-most regular season game-winning goals for a single club. Chawinga has the most regular season game-winning goals of any player since the start of the 2024 season.

On Aug. 8, Chawinga made history by scoring her 30th regular season career goal in what was her 40th regular season appearance. That makes her by far the fastest player in NWSL history to 30 regular season goals, surpassing Christen Press (51 games), Sophia Wilson (52 games), Kim Little (57 games) and Megan Rapinoe (57 games). She was also the first player in Kansas City history, and the 15th player in NWSL history, with 30 regular season goals for a single club.

Chawinga has scored 36 goals in 49 appearances across all competitions, with 15 of those goals being game-winners. That's more game-winners than any other player since she joined the NWSL last season.

Chawinga has had three separate goal-scoring streaks of five or more games in her regular season career. She is the first player in NWSL history to record three separate streaks of five or more consecutive regular season matches with a goal. Only six players in NWSL history have reached six in a row, including Chawinga twice.

She is also the first player in league history to score in seven consecutive regular season road matches. No other player has scored in more than four straight regular season road matches.

On May 16 at Orlando, Chawinga became the 18th player in NWSL history to record 25+ goals for one club (and the first Current player to reach 25). She needed just 34 games to score 25 regular season goals, six fewer than any other player in NWSL history (Kim Little, 40 matches).

Her opening strike vs. Utah on March 29 marked her eighth straight NWSL regular season appearance with a goal. That tied her own record first set from June 9 to Sept. 7, 2024. After her streak was broken on Sept. 13, Chawinga closed the 2024 regular season with a goal in her final five appearances, a streak she carried over to 2025.

**IRONWOMAN ...** Through Week 20, a total of nine players across the league have played every minute of the 2025 NWSL regular season (1,800), including Current defender **Kayla Sharples**. Kansas City has yet to have a player with an ironwoman season in club history.

Starting with the season opener, Sharples is on an active streak of 1,800 straight regular season minutes played. That ranks second in club history for consecutive regular season minutes played (AD Franch owns the record at 2,250 from 2023-24), and first for consecutive regular season minutes played in a single season.

She has also started in 28 consecutive regular season matches for the Current, beginning on Sept. 7, 2024, vs. Utah, which was also her Kansas City debut. Those 28 straight starts is tied for first in club history with current teammates **Lo LaBonta** and **Hailie Mace**.

Sharples is in the midst of her best season yet. She anchors a back line which leads the league in shutouts (13) and fewest goals allowed (10). She is one of seven defenders across the NWSL with multiple regular season goals and at least one assist.

Sharples ranks ninth in the NWSL in both shots blocked and clearances, and 10th in expected goals prevented by blocks. She was ranked No. 6 in ESPN's latest MVP Tracker from Sept. 17.

**HOT START ...** Twenty-four of the Current's 38 goals this season in NWSL regular season play have been in the first half, more than any other team in the NWSL this year. Thirteen have been in the opening 25 minutes, with seven in the first 15 minutes of play - also the most of any team this year. The club has scored a league-best 50 first half goals since the beginning of 2024.

The Current's plus-23 goal difference in the first half could equal the largest in the first half of matches over a full season in NWSL history (North Carolina, 2018 - 22 scored, 3 conceded). Kansas City has scored 24 first-half goals while only conceding one.

The Current has scored three or more goals in the first half four times this season, all at CPKC Stadium:

- vs. Portland Thorns, 3/15
- vs. Utah Royals, 3/29
- vs. Bay FC, 5/11
- vs. Racing Louisville FC, 6/14

Kansas City has scored three or more goals in the first half seven times in 46 regular season games during the **Vlatko Andonovski** era.

Some of the fastest goals in the NWSL this season have been by the Current: **Bia Zaneratto** (3' vs. Bay FC, May 11), **Michelle Cooper** (3' at Gotham FC, June 7), **Temwa Chawinga** (4' vs. Portland Thorns, March 15) an own goal (2' vs. Racing Louisville FC, June 14) and **Ellie Wheeler** (1' at Portland Thorns, Aug. 23). Wheeler's goal is the third fastest in the NWSL this year.

The Current has scored in the opening three minutes four times this season, something no other team has done more than three times in a single season in NWSL history.

On June 7 at Gotham FC, Cooper scored the opening goal in the third minute before Chawinga added another one in the 11th minute; those are the fastest two goals by one team to start an NWSL game this season.

**GOALS GALORE ...** The Current has scored 38 goals across 20 NWSL regular season matches in 2025. The club has found the back of the net in 17 of those 20 games. The Current has scored first in 21 of its last 24 regular season contests since Oct. 5, 2024, and is 16-1-0 when converting first this year.

Kansas City has 12 wins by two or more goals this season. Those 12 wins by a multi-goal margin is the most in a single regular season in NWSL history.

Entering Week 20, 16 players across the league have scored 5+ goals, including Kansas City's own **Temwa Chawinga** (12), **Bia Zaneratto** (5), **Debinha** (5) and **Michelle Cooper** (5). Four Kansas City player have also scored some of the fastest goals in the NWSL this year: **Ellie Wheeler** (1' at Portland), **Zaneratto** (3' vs. Bay), **Michelle Cooper** (3' at Gotham) and **Chawinga** (4' vs. Portland).

**DYNAMITE DEFENSE ...** Kansas City has a league-leading 13 shutouts and has conceded just 10 goals, which





is the fewest goals allowed in the NWSL through 20 matches this season. The NWSL regular season single-season record for least goals conceded is 17, set by North Carolina in 2018 and matched by Portland in 2021.

KC's 13 shutouts are a new single-season club record, surpassing the previous record of nine from 2024. Those 13 shutouts is also tied for the NWSL record currently co-owned by 2021 Portland and 2024 Orlando.

The Current is on an eight-match streak of clean sheets, another NWSL record. That broke the four-way tie of five with Seattle 2016, North Carolina 2021 and Orlando 2024.

**Lorena** has been credited with 11 shutouts, the most by any goalkeeper in the NWSL this year, while **Laurel Ivory** has been credited with two. On Aug. 30, Lorena tied the NWSL record for fastest goalkeeper to 10 regular season shutouts, doing so in 17 matches. She now shares that record with Nicole Barnhart (2013, FCKC) & Bella Bixby (2021, Portland).

Kansas City is the only team in the NWSL that has not conceded inside the first 15 minutes this season. The club has also not conceded a goal in the first 35 minutes of any match this regular season: The earliest goal allowed was by Seattle in the 37th minute. That is the latest an NWSL team has conceded an opponent's first goal this season.

Kansas City's defensive unit has not shied away from offensive action either. Current defenders have combined for five goals and 12 assists in 19 regular season matches this season. **Kayla Sharples**, one of six players on the roster with multiple goals this season, has two goals, both off headers, plus one assist. **Izzy Rodriguez** has a league-leading five assists, which ranks first in the NWSL, as well as one goal. **Hailie Mace** also has a league-best five assists, and she owns the club record with 11 regular season assists. **Elizabeth Ball** scored vs. Louisville on Aug. 1 in what was her 100th regular season cap and **Ellie Wheeler** had a goal and an assist vs. Portland on Aug. 23.

The Current is the only team which has had at least one defender and/or goalkeeper on the NWSL Best XI, presented by Amazon Prime, every month this season: **Alana Cook** and Lo-

rena in March, Rodriguez in April, Mace in May, Lorena and Sharples in June, and Rodriguez and Sharples in August. In fact, no other club besides Kansas City has had more than two goalkeeper/defenders honored on any of the five Best XI teams combined this year.

**SHE'S A KEEPER ... Lorena** has been credited with 11 shutouts this year, which extends her own single-season club record and is the second-most career shutouts in club history. The NWSL single-season record stands at 13 by Orlando's Anna Moorhouse in 2024. The KC Current club record for career shutouts is also 13, by AD Franch from 2021-24.

Lorena matched the NWSL record for fastest goalkeeper to 10 regular season shutouts, doing so in 17 matches, which tied Nicole Barnhart (2013, FCKC) and Bella Bixby (2021, Portland). She is also the first keeper in NWSL history to have gone 5-0-0 in her first five NWSL appearances. Lorena's five clean sheets through her first nine starts tied the most by a goalkeeper in NWSL history through their first nine appearances. Lorena's four straight clean sheets from March 22 to April 19 were also a new franchise record. She then matched that from Aug. 8 to Aug. 30.

Currently, Lorena ranks first in the NWSL with 11 clean sheets. Her .828 save percentage also ranks first among goalkeepers who have started double-digit games this season. Her six saves at Utah on Aug. 8 was a new single-season high.

Back in December 2024, Lorena signed a three-year contract through 2027 with an option for 2028. Internationally, she made her Brazil Senior National Team debut in 2021. After missing the 2023 FIFA World Cup due to injury, she played every minute for Brazil in the 2024 Olympic Games. She kept a clean sheet in three of Brazil's six matches in the tournament and led her team to the silver medal.

Most recently, Lorena guided Brazil to its fifth consecutive, and ninth overall, Copa América title. Her game-winning save in the penalty kick shootout clinched the championship.

**THE LO-DOWN ...** Midfielder **Lo'eau LaBonta** has solidified herself as one of the league's all-time greats from

the penalty spot. On Aug. 30 vs. North Carolina, she converted her fourth PK of the year. That moved her up to the second-most regular season penalties scored in NWSL history with 13. She trails Megan Rapinoe (14) and is tied with Marta (13).

All four of the captain's goals this year have been from the penalty spot, which leads the league. She is 13-of-14 from the spot during her regular season career, all for Kansas City. She has converted each of her last 10 penalty attempts (regular season and playoffs).

LaBonta's historic penalty goal vs. North Carolina was also her 20th regular season career goal, becoming the second player in KC history with 20 for the same club. She became the 31st player in NWSL history with 20 regular season goals for the same club. She is also one goal away from becoming the 33rd player in league history to score 25 regular season goals.

The captain has played in 174 regular season matches and is one of 44 players in league history to reach the 150-marker. She has 10 NWSL Best XI honors – tied for second all-time – and earned the recognition the first two months of this season.

LaBonta earned her first USWNT call-up in May. She made her first appearance for the Stars and Stripes on May 31, becoming the oldest player to debut for the USWNT in the program's 40-year history. She also subbed in during the second match on June 3.

**DEBINHA DOMINATION ... Debinha** has five goals and an assist on the year. Those five goals and assist came in the first nine games of the season before being sidelined with injury; she returned to the pitch on Aug. 1.

Debinha had her first brace of the season on May 11 vs. Bay FC as one of 11 players in the NWSL who has had recorded at least one brace this year. It was Debinha's fourth career regular season brace, and second with Kansas City (she also had two with North Carolina). Her goal in the 38th minute to make it a brace was her fourth direct free kick goal across all competitions, which ranks third all-time.

Debinha is now seventh all-time for leading scorers in the NWSL regular





season with 52 goals. She's behind Sam Kerr (77), Lynn Biyendolo (70), Christine Sinclair (66), Alex Morgan (60), Ashley Hatch (59) and Jess McDonald (54). Debinha ranks third among active leading scorers in the NWSL regular season with 52, trailing only Biyendolo (70) and Hatch (59).

With 52 goals and 25 assists on her resume, no other player has recorded more goal contributions in regular season NWSL play than Debinha since her league debut in 2017.

Debinha joined an elite group on April 12. Her opening strike in the 16th minute at San Diego propelled her to become the eighth player in NWSL history to notch 50 regular season career goals. She became just the fifth player in NWSL history to hit the 50-25 milestone, and the second active player along with Lynn Biyendolo. Also on the list is Alex Morgan (60g, 28a), Jess McDonald (54g, 31a) and Megan Rapinoe (51g, 26a).

Additionally, Debinha became the sixth player in NWSL history to join the 40 goal-20 assist club, which features only seven players. She is one of three active players to hit that milestone alongside Lynn Biyendolo and Jess Fishlock. Sam Kerr (77g, 24a), Alex Morgan (60g, 28a), Jess McDonald (54g, 31a) and Megan Rapinoe (51g, 26a) have also reached that milestone.

Across all competitions\* (regular season, playoffs, Challenge Cup, 2020 Fall Series, Summer Cup), Debinha currently ranks fourth among goal leaders in NWSL history with 76 goals. That trails only Lynn Biyendolo (82g), Christine Sinclair (79g) and Sam Kerr (78g). *\*Does not include non-NWSL competitions (international friendlies, international matches, Women's Cup, Teal Rising Cup, pre-season games, etc.)*

Currently with 19, Debinha is one game-winning goal away from becoming the third player in league history to notch 20 game-winners in the regular season. Only Lynn Biyendolo (23) and Ashley Hatch (21) have more game-winning goals.

Debinha made her 150th regular season appearance on August 1. She became the 44th player in league history to hit that milestone, and the first Brazilian. On July 6, 2024, she became the first Brazilian to reach 10,000 career regular season minutes.

With nearly 150 caps for her country since her senior team debut in 2011, Debinha has represented Brazil in two FIFA World Cups (2019, 2023) and two Olympic Games (2016, 2020) and was an alternate for the 2012 Brazilian Olympic Team. Her 61 international goals rank third all-time for her country.

**COACHING MILESTONE ...** On Sept. 6, head coach **Vlatko Andonovski** achieved his 100th career regular season victory with a 2-0 win over Bay FC. He became the second head coach in league history to reach the century mark. Only Seattle's Laura Harvey has more (110, active).

Andonovski has already reached some other historic milestones this season. KC's March 22 match against the Washington Spirit marked his 200th game coached across all NWSL competitions (regular season, playoffs, challenge cup, fall series, summer cup). He is the fourth coach to reach that milestone. KC's Aug. 16 match vs. Orlando Pride was Andonovski's 200th regular season game coached. He's the second head coach to hit that mark; only Laura Harvey (256, active) has more.

Andonovski was named the NWSL Coach of the Month in June and August. An impactful way to recognize coaches across the league, the NWSL began its Coach of the Month honor in May 2025 to coincide with its other monthly awards. Andonovski has now received the recognition in two of the three months it has been awarded.

### **CHAWINGA-COOPER CONNECTION**

... In Kansas City's game at Gotham FC on June 7, **Michelle Cooper** scored the opening goal in the third minute before **Temwa Chawinga** added another one in the 11th minute. Those are the fastest two goals by one team to start an NWSL game this season.

It marked the fourth time in Chawinga's career she has recorded a goal and an assist in the same match, and the first time this season. It was the second time Cooper notched a goal and an assist in her career with the first being against the Utah Royals on March 29 earlier this season. (Cooper also had a goal and an assist vs. Corinthians SC in the 2025 Teal Rising Cup).

That was the fourth time in KC Current club history, and the first time this year, there had been multiple players record a goal and assist in the same game.

Chawinga and Cooper have combined for five goals in their careers, including four this year. Most recently, Cooper assisted Chawinga's goal at Racing Louisville FC on August 1.

Cooper has 13 goal contributions since the start of last season (8 goals, 5 assists), one of 17 NWSL players with 13+ goal contributions since the start of the 2024 regular season. Four of those 17 players have reached that mark with the Current (Chawinga - 40, **Bia Zaneratto** - 15 and **Debinha** - 14).

**#KCBABY ...** On July 30, midfielder **Vanessa DiBernardo** and her husband, Andy, announced their pregnancy. She has been placed on maternity leave.

**ROBINSON'S RETURN ...** Kansas City removed defender **Gabrielle Robinson** from the season ending injury (SEI) list on Aug. 22. Her reactivation came the day before the Current's match vs. Portland, and she made her first appearance in 455 days vs. the Thorns.

Robinson initially inked a three-year contract with Kansas City after joining the Current in January 2023 when she was selected as the No. 15 overall pick in the 2023 NWSL Draft out of West Virginia. Robinson put together one of the best rookie seasons in franchise history: She set club records for a first-year player with 20 appearances (19 starts) and 1,701 minutes played, leading all NWSL rookies in blocked shots (18), interceptions (23) and clearances (72). Robinson also started all seven matches of the 2023 UKG NWSL Challenge Cup.

Robinson's sophomore season was cut short after she suffered a torn ACL in May 2024 and was subsequently placed on the SEI list. Establishing herself as a vital part of the Current's defense prior to the injury, she logged a full 90 minutes in the first 10 regular season matches. She scored her first professional goal against Racing Louisville FC on May 18 during second-half stoppage time.

**ACTIVATED ALEX ...** The Current removed forward **Alex Pfeiffer** from the





season ending injury (SEI) list on July 11. Her reactivation came the day before the Teal Rising Cup where she subbed in during both matches, including her first appearance in 379 days on July 12. Her first NWSL appearance was on Sept. 13, 422 days after her last league appearance.

Pfeiffer, who signed with the Current in October 2023, was placed on the SEI list in July 2024 after a torn anterior cruciate ligament (ACL) and meniscus. Her rookie season in the NWSL was cut short after 10 appearances. Inking her first professional contract at just 15 years and 338 days old, Pfeiffer became the fourth youngest player signed in NWSL history and the club's first player through the league's Under-18 Entry Mechanism. She made an immediate impact by scoring the game-winning goal in her professional debut on March 16, 2024, against the Portland Thorns, making her the youngest goal scorer in league history at the time at 16 years, 3 months and 20 days old, and the second oldest to this day.

**ALLY, ACQUIRED ...** On August 1, the KC Current announced that they had acquired **Ally Sentnor**, the 2024 U.S. Soccer Young Female Player of the Year and the No. 1 overall selection in the 2024 NWSL Draft, from the Utah Royals. In exchange for Sentnor, the Current sent \$300,000 in intraleague transfer funds upon execution. The Current will send an additional \$200,000 in intraleague transfer funds in 2026 and \$100,000 in 2027. Sentnor's contract with Kansas City runs through the 2026 season.

Sentnor's club debut came on Aug. 8 against the Royals, her former club team, in Utah. Her first start for KC was on Aug. 23 vs. the Portland Thorns.

**HERE TO STAY ...** Three KC Current standouts, **Michelle Cooper**, **Izzy Rodriguez** and **Kayla Sharples**, recently re-signed their contracts with the club. Cooper, Robinson and Rodriguez, all who have played their entire professional careers in Kansas City, signed three year deals through the 2028 season. Sharples inked a two-year deal through 2027 with a mutual option for 2028.

Cooper first signed with the Current in February 2023. She was the No. 2 overall pick in the 2023 NWSL Draft after two standout collegiate seasons at Duke where she was the 2022 MAC Hermann Trophy winner. At the time she re-signed her contract, she had 63 appearances, 52 starts, 12 goals, eight assists and over 5,400 minutes across all competitions.

Robinson first joined with the Current ahead of the 2023 season after being selected as the No. 15 overall pick in the 2023 NWSL Draft after a remarkable college career at West Virginia, signing a three-year deal. At the time she re-signed her contract, she had played 38 matches (37 starts) and logged 3,212 minutes across all competitions, scoring her first pro goal during the 2024 regular season.

Robinson put together one of the best rookie seasons in franchise history: She set club records for a first-year player with 20 appearances (19 starts) and 1,701 minutes played, leading all NWSL rookies in blocked shots (18), interceptions (23) and clearances (72). Robinson also started all seven matches of the 2023 UKG NWSL Challenge Cup.

Rodriguez first signed with the Current ahead of the 2022 season after being selected in the fourth round of the 2022 NWSL Draft following a standout career at Ohio State. She then re-signed a two-year deal with the Current in 2023. At the time she re-signed her contract, she had 93 appearances, 52 starts, four goals, 10 assists and over 5,000 minutes across all competitions.

Sharples arrived in Kansas City in August 2024 via a trade with Bay FC. Her

pro career began when she was the No. 26 overall selection by the Chicago in the 2019 NWSL Draft out of Northwestern University; she played for Chicago for five seasons. At the time she re-signed her contract, she has played in 87 games across all competitions in her entire pro career.

**ON LOAN ...** The KC Current announced on July 18 that they were loaning midfielder **Jereko** to HB Køge Women in Denmark. Jereko, who signed with the Current in August 2024, will join one of the premier Danish women's football clubs ahead of its upcoming 2025-26 season. Upon arriving in Kansas City in Summer 2024, Jereko contributed to the Current's 2024 NWSL x Liga MX Femenil Summer Cup victory. Internationally, the Mombasa, Kenya native has been a stalwart of the Kenyan National Team, colloquially known as the Harambee Starlets, since 2015 and is captain. She has participated in several major tournaments including the 2018 Africa Women Cup of Nations qualifier.

On Aug. 21, the club announced that forward **Flora Marta Lacho** would also go on loan to HB Køge for the remainder of its 2025-26 season. Lacho made history as the first Angolan international to sign with a NWSL club. Her Kansas City debut came on March 22 against the Washington Spirit and she appeared in five additional NWSL regular season games. She earned a spot in the starting lineup against Seattle Reign FC on May 3 and Racing Louisville FC on August 1, logging a season-high 66 minutes in the latter. Lacho also started both matches of the inaugural Teal Rising Cup presented by Visit Missouri and forced an own goal in the Current's win over Palmeiras in the opening match.

**RECORD BREAKERS ...** On April 26 at North Carolina, Kansas City set a new NWSL record for scoring multiple goals in eight consecutive regular season contests, a streak that began on Oct. 19, 2024. That snapped the record of seven straight games set by the 2013 Western NY Flash (May 1 to June 19) and the 2022 North Carolina Courage (July 10 to August 28).

**Temwa Chawinga's** assist on KC's opening goal on April 26 was her 30th regular-season goal contribution (23 goals, 7 assists) in just her 31st career NWSL match. That equaled Kim Little





for the fewest matches to reach 30 career regular-season goal contributions in NWSL history.

Chawinga set more history on May 11 against Bay FC. With her goal in the 62nd minute, she became the first player in NWSL history to score in each of her first three regular season games against two different clubs. She had already done so against the Washington Spirit. She then became the fifth player in NWSL history to score in each of her first four meetings against a single opponent across all competitions at Gotham FC on June 7.

On May 16 vs. the Orlando Pride, Chawinga netted her 25th regular season goal. She needed just 34 games to score 25 regular season goals, six fewer than any other player in NWSL history (Kim Little - 40 matches). She's the 18th player in NWSL history to record 25+ goals for one club, and the first Current player to do so.

The team's win over Houston on April 19 set a new NWSL record for nine straight regular season wins, snapping a tie with Orlando.

The Current is also the first team in NWSL history to record 17 wins in a span of 19 regular season matches. KC's plus-21 goal difference (31 scored, 10 conceded) was the best through 14 matches in league history.

During Week 15 against the Utah Royals, the Current earned their 50th regular season win in club history, doing so in their 109th regular season game. That tied Seattle (2013) as the third fastest team to reach 50 regular season wins. Only North Carolina (2017, 77 games) and Portland (2013, 106 games) have been faster.

Entering Week 21, KC has had 12 regular season wins by two or more goals. Those 12 wins by a multi-goal margin is the most in a single in NWSL history.

Kansas City became the fastest team to reach 15 regular season wins in one season, doing so in just 18 games. The club also equaled Orlando's record from 2024 for fastest team to clinch a playoff spot, doing so with eight regular season games remaining.

On Sept. 13, Kansas City became the fastest team in NWSL history to reach 50 points, doing so in just 20 matches.

**BEST OF THE BEST ...** The NWSL announced on Sept. 5 that forward **Temwa Chawinga** and defenders **Izzy Rodriguez** and **Kayla Sharples** were named to the NWSL Best XI of the Month for August. KC's three recipients were the most of any team in August. The Current has garnered a league-leading 16 Best XI selections between March, April, May, June and August. No other club in NWSL history has had more players recognized on the Best XI team in the first five months of the season.

Garnering praise for NWSL Best XI for August for the fourth time this season is Chawinga, who was also tabbed to the team in March, May and June. This is the ninth such honor of her career, which is now tied for third all-time. Both Rodriguez and Sharples landed on the Best XI for the third time in their careers and second time this season, with Rodriguez being recognized in May and Sharples most recently in June.

A league-leading three Current players were named to the NWSL Best XI of the Month for June: forward **Temwa Chawinga**, goalkeeper **Lorena** and defender **Kayla Sharples**. It was Chawinga's third honor of the year, and the second time for both Lorena and Sharples.

A league-high-tying two Current players were on the NWSL Best XI of the Month for May: forward **Temwa Chawinga** and defender **Hailie Mace**. That was Chawinga's second honor of the season, and seventh of her career. It was the third of Mace's career.

A league-high-tying three Current players were tabbed to the NWSL Best XI of the Month for April: defender **Izzy Rodriguez** along with midfielders **Debinha** and **Lo'eau LaBonta**. It was the 15th such honor in Debinha's career, which set a new NWSL record. It was the 10th for LaBonta, moving her up to a tie for second all-time.

A league-leading five Current players were named to the NWSL Best XI of the Month for March. Goalkeeper **Lorena**, defender **Alana Cook**, midfielders **Debinha** and **Lo'eau LaBonta** along with forward **Temwa Chawinga** landed on the team. Kansas City's five honorees were the second-most in league history for a given month behind Chicago's six from September 2019.

**2X PLAYER OF THE MONTH ...** The NWSL announced on June 5 that **Temwa Chawinga** was named the NWSL Player of the Month, pres. by EA SPORTS, for May. She also garnered the first NWSL Player of the Month recognition of 2025 back in March. Chawinga has won the award five times in her career since joining the league ahead of the 2024 season. She now owns sole possession of the NWSL record for most Player of the Month honors, breaking the tie she previously shared with Kim Little and Megan Rapinoe. Last year, she became the second player in NWSL history to win the award three times in a single season, joining Kim Little from 2014.

**TEAL RISING CUP RECAP ...** The inaugural Teal Rising Cup, presented by Visit Missouri and hosted by the Kansas City Current at CPKC Stadium, was held on July 12 and 15. The four-team tournament included the Current, Chicago Stars FC and Brazilian Serie A1 clubs Corinthians SC and Palmeiras. Kansas City was crowned champion of the tournament, and forward **Haley Hopkins** was named the MVP.

The hosts opened the tournament with a 3-0 shutout win over Palmeiras on July 12. Hopkins bagged a brace with goals in the 34th and 44th minutes, both which were assisted by **Bayley Feist**, before an own goal in the forced by **Flora Marta Lacho** in the 50th minute. **Laurel Ivory** was credited with the clean sheet.

Kansas City prevailed for a 2-1 win in the championship game vs. Corinthians SC. **Lo'eau LaBonta** assisted **Michelle Cooper's** opening goal in the third minute. Cooper then assisted **Mary Long's** game-winning goal in the 23rd minute before Corinthians put one back in the 25th minute.

**FIRST THINGS FIRST ...** Several KC Current players experienced firsts during the summer break. At the start of the break, defender **Izzy Rodriguez** earned her first USWNT call-up. She made her debut vs. Ireland on June 29 and scored her first senior national team goal in the contest, becoming the 23rd player in the USWNT's 40-year history to score in their first cap. Along with forward **Michelle Cooper**, midfielder-





er **Claire Hutton** joined Rodriguez on that USWNT roster: Hutton recorded her first USWNT assist vs. Ireland on June 29 and notched her first career goal vs. Canada on July 2.

In the Teal Rising Cup, goalkeeper **Laurel Ivory**, forward **Mary Long** and defender **Katie Scott** debuted in the starting lineup. Ivory made her first appearance for the club and earned her first clean sheet for KC on July 12, Scott made her professional debut and Long scored her first game-winning goal to seal the Current's Teal Rising Cup trophy. Forward **Haley Hopkins** had a brace for her first multi-goal game with the Current, and both goals were assisted by midfielder **Bayley Feist** who notched the first multi-assist match of her Kansas City tenure.

Additionally, defender **Kayla Sharples** donned the captain's band for the first time as a member of the KC Current vs. Palmeiras and forward **Alex Pfeiffer** returned to the pitch for the first time in 379 days after being removed from the season ending injury (SEI) list on July 11.

**MADAM PRESIDENT ...** Kansas City Current forward **Haley Hopkins** is the president of the NWSL Players Association (NWSLPA). Hopkins takes over for Tori Huster, who moved into a deputy executive director role alongside executive director Meghann Burke. Hopkins is the fourth NWSLPA President in the organization's history.

Hopkins is the first NWSLPA President in Kansas City Current history and will be largely responsible for making governing decisions on the behalf of all NWSL players. Hopkins previously served as an NWSLPA player representative, one of two elected by each NWSL team, with the North Carolina Courage.

In August, Hopkins was accepted to the Harvard Business School Fall 2025 Crossover Into Business Program. The program is a semester-long program that helps professional athletes develop business skills for during and after their careers, matching them with MBA student mentors for case study discussions and business education tailored to their interests.

Hopkins signed with the Current in late January 2025 as part of a trade with the North Carolina Courage. She scored her first goal for Kansas City on April 26

at her former club, the Courage, and dished out her first KC assist on June 14 vs. Racing Louisville FC. She was named MVP of the Teal Rising Cup for bagging a brace against Palmeiras on July 12.

**USWNT AT CPKC ...** The USWNT is set to make history in Kansas City this fall with its first-ever match at CPKC Stadium, the first stadium in the world purpose-built for a women's professional sports team. The USWNT will take place on Wednesday, Oct. 29, at 7 p.m. CT, against New Zealand as part of a three-match schedule during the FIFA international window.

"The investment that Angie and Chris Long have made in their club and this venue is massively impressive, important for the future of the women's game in the USA and deserves to be rewarded with a match like this," said USWNT head coach Emma Hayes.

**HUTTON X LHIA ...** **Claire Hutton** is the Current's nominee for the 2025 Lauren Holiday Impact Award, presented by Nationwide. The prestigious award honors players making a significant impact in their community. Hutton wore a commemorative Lauren Holiday Impact Award armband during the Aug. 30 home match, which was her LHIA Appreciation Match.

On Sept. 2, the NWSL announced that Hutton had won the Fan Impact Challenge for the 2025 Lauren Holiday Impact Award. Hutton is supporting MINDDRIVE as her community partner. As the Fan Impact Challenge winner, Hutton receives a \$10,000 donation to MINDDRIVE.

**PITCH (SIDE) PERFECT ...** On May 13, the Kansas City Current announced a historic partnership with Pitchside Coffee as the newest restaurant partner at CPKC Stadium. Pitchside Coffee was founded in 2024 by six current and former KC Current players: **Elizabeth Ball, Vanessa DiBernardo, Kristen Hamilton, Hailie Mace, Desiree Scott** and **Mallory Weber**. They officially opened a storefront in KC's Crossroads District on Aug. 31.

Pitchside Coffee is the first player-owned vendor to be permanently

featured inside a NWSL or women's sports venue. It is also the only food or beverage vendor in an American professional sports venue owned and founded by active professional athletes. Among other beverages, one unique menu item available at each home match is a specialty latte inspired by a KC Current player, which changes each home game.

**HISTORY BREAKERS ...** On March 26, the Kansas City Current, Palmer Square Real Estate Management and Marquee Development broke ground on the next phase of the KC Current's generational investment in the Berkley Riverfront and downtown Kansas City, Mo. This came just 12 months after the opening of CPKC Stadium – the first stadium in the world purpose-built for a women's professional team – and signals the Current's continued and unprecedented investment in women's sports and the Kansas City region.

Building on their partnership with Port KC and shared vision for a world-class riverfront, the Current is embarking on a multi-phased, \$1 billion privately financed project that will continue its efforts to transform the Missouri Riverfront, extending the fabric of downtown Kansas City to its waterfront. The recent groundbreaking encompasses a \$200 million phase that has 429 multi-family homes, 48,000 square feet of retail and 2+ acres of riverfront gathering space, including a new town square and a riverfront promenade. Components of the project will be delivered throughout 2026.

On July 17, the Current broke ground on another phase of development in Riverside, Mo. The next phase of growth includes the development of Riverside Stadium, addition of a new state-of-the-art Performance Center and the expansion of the Current's grass and turf pitches, bringing the Kansas City Current's total investment in player facilities in Riverside to \$52mm. All three facilities are set to open by the end of the year.

The new Riverside Stadium will be a 2,000 seat outdoor stadium, featuring a FIFA certified, heated grass pitch and fan amenities. The Performance Center will be a state-of-the-art facility focused on player development, agility and strength, bringing the Current's total





training and headquarters footprint to over 35,000 sf. The construction of four new grass youth soccer pitches will bring the Current's total training campus to 12 grass and turf pitches, including one state-of-the-art heated pitch.

### **KC CURRENT PRINCIPAL OWNERS ACQUIRE HB KØGE WOMEN**

Ballard Capital, an investment company controlled and owned by Kansas City Current co-founders and co-owners Angie and Chris Long, signed an agreement to purchase HB Køge Women in May 2025. The acquisition is a continuation of the Longs' unwavering commitment to investing in women's soccer at the highest level while raising the bar for players, supporters and communities both nationally and internationally.

Located approximately 30 minutes south of Copenhagen in Køge, HB Køge plays in the Kvindeliga, the highest level of women's football in Denmark organized by the Danish Football Association (DBU). HB Køge was founded through the merger of historic clubs Køge Boldklub and Herfølge Boldklub in 2009, and the women's side was registered in 2017. HB Køge won the Kvindeliga three straight seasons in 2021, 2022, and 2023, having also competed in the UEFA Women's Champions League in 2021, 2022, and 2023. The club recently concluded the 2024-25 season, earning bronze to secure its spot in the new UEFA Women's Europa Cup next year.

**KC CURRENT II ...** On August 4, the Kansas City Current formally launched its second team, Kansas City Current II. With the establishment of Current II, the Current becomes the first NWSL club to fully form a second team. The creation of the second team is further testament to the Current's long-term commitment to player development, performance excellence and becoming the preeminent women's football club in the world.

Kansas City Current II is a full-time, fully funded team that will partner with the Kansas City Current to build the future of women's soccer. The launch of Current II will bridge youth and college players to top-tier soccer, reinforcing the club's vision of a complete development pathway from grassroots to professional. Under the direction of Kansas City

Current II head coach Vasil Ristov, the second team will mirror the first team in terms of training and periodization through training sessions, resources, matches and friendlies. Current II will have a fully dedicated staff, nutritional support, a designated strength and conditioning program, facilities and more.

**BUSY BREAK ...** Several Kansas City Current players were still in action during the NWSL break for international duty. Midfielder **Rocky Rodríguez** and Costa Rica met forward **Nichelle Prince** and Canada for a friendly in Toronto, Ontario, in which Team Canada prevailed, 4-1. Rodríguez saw a full 90 minutes on the pitch. Prince subbed in during the 63rd minute vs. Costa Rica as well as in the Allstate Continental Clasico with the United States in Washington, D.C.

Brazil called up goalkeeper **Lorena** for an international friendly against the French National Team in France at the end of June. Lorena logged a full 90 minutes in the 3-2 loss. Lorena and Brazil will now compete in the championship match of the 2025 Women's Copa América on Aug. 2 in Ecuador.

Forward **Michelle Cooper**, midfielder **Claire Hutton** and defender **Izzy Rodriguez** were with the United States Women's National Team (USWNT), the latter who earned her first senior team call-up. The USWNT played two matches against the Republic of Ireland and one vs. Canada, going 3-0-0 and outscoring its opponents 11-0. Cooper started the first match against Ireland as well as against Canada, logging 73 and 68 minutes, respectively. Hutton played in all three games with two starts, recording her first career assist vs. Ireland in game two and her first career goal vs. Canada in what were only her fifth and sixth caps, respectively. Rodriguez made her debut in the second meeting with Ireland, finding the back of the net to become the 23rd player in the USWNT's 40-year history to score in their first cap.

Additionally, forward **Mary Long** and defender **Katie Scott** were with the U.S. Youth National Team for a joint Under-18 and U-19 training camp from June 24 to July 1 at McCurry Park in Fayetteville, Ga. They were two of four NWSL professional players on the U-18 squad. The duo, which was part of the USA's bronze-winning U-17 World Cup team in 2024, most

recently helped the U-20 team to a 2026 FIFA World Cup berth at the Concacaf U-20 Championship earlier in June.

**FIRST HALF WRAPPED ...** At the halfway point of the 2025 NWSL regular season, the Kansas City Current remains atop the league leaderboard – a place it has been for nine consecutive weeks – with 33 points and an 11-2-0 record. The club's 11 victories through 13 matches are already the second highest regular season win total in franchise history. The team closed the first half of the regular season with a 1-0 victory over Angel City FC on June 20, which marked the club's sixth consecutive win for the second longest regular season winning streak in franchise history.

Kansas City has scored 29 goals across its 13 matches so far in 2025. Twenty of those 29 goals this season have been in the first half, with 12 of those coming in the opening 25 minutes. The Current has scored first in all but one of its games this year and is 11-1-0 when converting first. Four of the seven fastest goals in the NWSL this year have been by Current forwards: **Bia Zaneratto** (3' vs. Bay FC, May 11), **Michelle Cooper** (3' at Gotham FC, June 7) and **Temwa Chawinga** (4' vs. Portland Thorns, March 15), plus an own goal by Racing Louisville FC on June 14 in the second minute.

Chawinga, last year's NWSL MVP and Golden Boot winner, is currently second in this season's Golden Boot race with eight goals and two assists while defender **Hailie Mace's** four assists also rank second. Kansas City boasts a plus-19 goal difference, nine better than the next closest team. On the defensive end, Kansas City's six clean sheets – all credited to goalkeeper **Lorena** – lead the league. Lorena is also now the outright owner of the club record for regular season shutouts. The team has allowed just 10 goals through its first 13 regular season games, tied for the fewest in the NWSL.

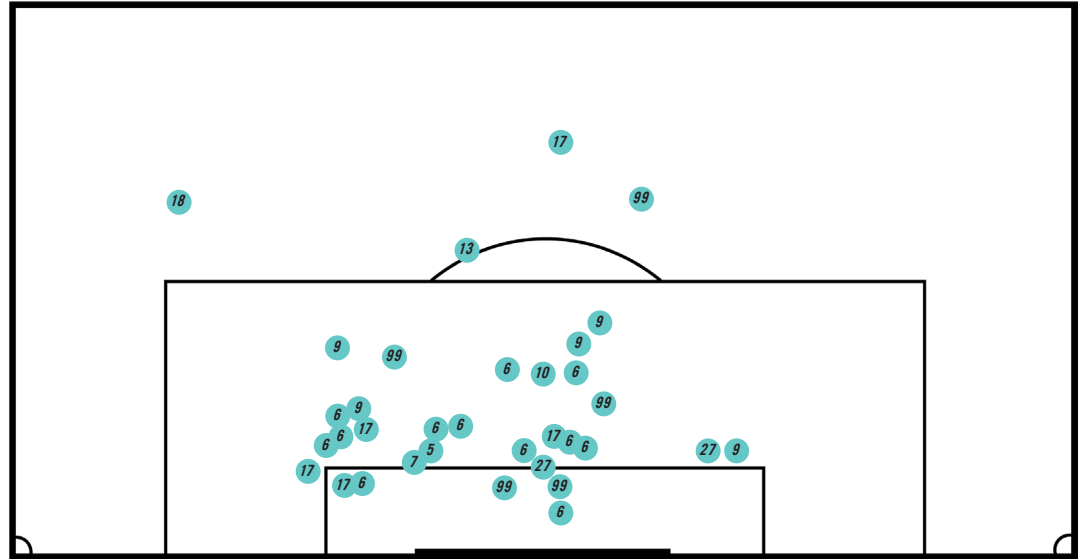

The Kansas City Current announced **Vlatko Andonovski** as the third Head Coach and first Sporting Director in club history on October 23, 2023.

From 2019-2023, Andonovski led the U.S. Women's National Team. While at the helm he accumulated a record of 51-5-9. He led the team to the Concacaf W Championship in 2022, a bronze medal at the 2020 Tokyo Olympics and four straight championships at the SheBelieves Cup (2020-2023).

A relatively unknown coach in 2013, Andonovski was named the first head coach of FC Kansas City. Since that time, he has become one of the most successful and recognized coaches around the world. With a record of 85-50-50 across NWSL regular season and postseason play, Andonovski is one of only five coaches to have presided over 150 or more games and one of two coaches with multiple NWSL Championship titles to his resumé.

He spent five seasons with FC Kansas City (2013-2017) and two with Reign FC (2018-2019). He was named the NWSL Coach of the Year in 2013 and 2019 and is the only coach to achieve that honor with more than one club. Across eight seasons in the NWSL, he took his team to the playoffs six times and won back-to-back titles in 2014 and 2015.

On March 22, 2025, Andonovski became the fourth coach to reach 200 career matches across all NWSL competitions (regular season, playoffs, challenge cup, fall series, summer cup). His 200th regular season match coached came on Aug. 16, 2025, becoming the second head coach to hit that mark. He coached his 100th career regular season on Sept. 6, once again being the second head coach to reach the century mark.

Andonovski's experience also includes coaching the indoor Missouri Comets, leading the team to the Major Indoor Soccer League title in 2014 and an undefeated 20-0 season in 2015. He came to the United States in 2000 to play professional indoor soccer, mainly with the Wichita Wings and Kansas City Comets, but prior to that he played six seasons in his native country of North Macedonia.

He holds a U.S. Soccer Pro License, a United Soccer Coaches Goalkeeping License and United Soccer Coaches Premier License. He earned his undergraduate degree locally at Park University and earned a master's degree in Coaching Education from Ohio University in 2018. He is currently pursuing a PhD in Sports Leadership at Concordia University in Chicago. Andonovski lives in Kansas City, Missouri, with his wife Bijana and children, Luka and Daria. His eldest daughter, Dragana, graduated from Park University and also lives in the Kansas City area.
