MATCH PREVIEW

Racing Louisville FC is gaining traction just as the season heads into its decisive phase.

A mere days after its most resounding result of the season, Racing welcomes another in-form side — Seattle Reign FC — to Lynn Family Stadium for a significant Wednesday showdown in the playoff race. Kickoff is set for 6:30 p.m. ET.

The rare midweek game will be Women in Business Night, featuring an hour-long panel available for ticket holders leading up to the gates opening. Tickets and more information on the match's promotions can be found at RacingLouFC.com/business.

Racing (6-11-2, 20 points) picked up a club-record third straight regular season win Saturday evening, comprehensively topping expansion side Boston Legacy FC, 4-1. The result saw Louisville move up to 13th place in the NWSL standings, surpassing both Boston and Bay FC.

The Racing attack, in front of a season-high crowd of 7,018, produced a show. Each of Louisville's four shots on goal ended up in the back of the net, as Kayla Fischer led the way with the club's sixth brace on the season.

Since the start of August, only the North Carolina Courage (13) have scored more goals than Racing (9).

The clock keeps on ticking, however, with another challenge coming Wednesday. In 11 regular season matchups to date, Louisville has not beaten Seattle, which has won the last four encounters. The series has seen a lot of draws — six to be exact — with three coming at Lynn Family Stadium.

A win Wednesday would be massive for Racing as it continues its climb up the table. With the Reign occupying the final eighth-place playoff spot, a maximum three points would bring Louisville within four of the postseason cutoff.

Like Racing, Seattle (8-7-3, 27 points) rolls into the midweek amid its best stretch of the season. The Reign extended its unbeaten streak to four contests last Friday after besting Chicago Stars FC, 1-0. It was a game where Seattle had the opportunity to win by multiple goals, finishing with a new 2026 single-game high for shots (24).

Wednesday is the start of a two-game road swing for the Reign, which heads off to Kansas City next for a Saturday encounter with the Current. Seattle is a top-six side away from home this year, collecting 13 points through nine road games. Its last two away results were wins over Bay and San Diego Wave FC.

Story lines...

Another Buckeye brace: For the second week running, an Ohio State University product recorded a brace for Louisville. In the meeting versus Boston last Saturday, it was Kayla Fischer who delivered it. The Ohio native netted Racing's opener and the final goal against the Legacy, bringing her goal tally for the season to a team-leading six — three more than her previous single-season career high. It went down as Fischer's first professional brace, and first multi-goal game since Oct. 16, 2022, during her final year at OSU.

Just scoring goals for fun: The week after netting a brace in Orlando and becoming the club's new all-time scoring leader, Emma Sears played a crucial role in Louisville's offensive display versus Boston. Sears scored Racing's third goal Saturday — the 20th of her career — while also delivering a pinpoint ball to Fischer for her fifth assist on the campaign. She currently has 10 goal involvements this season and 22 since the beginning of 2025, more than any other American player in the NWSL during that span, per Opta.

Making their marks: Katie O'Kane and Makenna Morris each tallied an assist in the commanding triumph over the Legacy. O'Kane, who now has an assist in consecutive

games, also scored a penalty, joining Sears and Fischer as players with multiple goal contributions on the night. Morris' assist, which set up Fischer for Racing's first goal just before halftime, was her first as a Louisville player. O'Kane's assist total is now at four on the campaign, one more than what she had as a rookie last year.

Out the gates firing: Out of Seattle's 23 goals scored this season, 17 have been scored in the first half, accounting for roughly 74% of the total. Wednesday's visitors are one of two teams that have scored over 70% of their total goals in the first half, alongside Bay FC. Notably, both of the Reign's finishes against Racing in the first meeting this season were scored in the opening period.

The sheer definition of a breakout: In her first full season since returning from a loan in the USL Super League, forward Maddie Mercado has quietly emerged as a force in the Reign's attacking line. Mercado, 25, leads Seattle in goals with six — good for double that of any other Reign player. She netted just one goal in her first two seasons in the NWSL across 19 league appearances. Her most recent finish came last week when she recorded the winner versus Chicago Stars FC. To put it even more into perspective, Mercado's goal tally so far is already tied with Seattle's two leading scorers from last year, Emeri Adames and Jess Fishlock. Her activity without the ball is also a standout aspect of her game, as she is among the league leaders in possessions won in the final third (23).

ABOUT THE CLUB

Since starting play in 2021, Racing Louisville FC has blazed a trail as its city's only top-tier professional sports team.

Named as an ode to Louisville's Churchill Downs and the Kentucky Derby, Racing competes in the National Women's Soccer League, the world's premier women's professional soccer league. NWSL stars regularly take part in the FIFA World Cup and the Olympics, among other notable international competitions.

Racing Louisville plays in the largest soccer-specific stadium in the state — 15,304-capacity Lynn Family Stadium in Louisville's Butchertown neighborhood just east of downtown. The stadium also houses Racing's brother club, Louisville City FC of the USL Championship.

Both LouCity and Racing maintain daily operations from the Lynn Family Sports Vision & Training Center, located at Champions Park about two miles east of the stadium. The facility also houses the LouCity & Racing Academy and the LouCity & Racing Foundation, the organization's charitable arm.

John Neace heads a local ownership group as chairman of Soccer Holdings, LLC — the parent company of Louisville City FC and Racing Louisville FC. Former LouCity coach James O'Connor serves as the organization's president.

Racing has so far lifted two trophies, winning The Women's Cup's inaugural tournament in 2021 in a penalty kick shootout over German power Bayern Munich. Louisville traveled to Brazil to win The Women's Cup again in 2025, also prevailing on penalties against Palmeiras. Later in 2025, Racing qualified for the NWSL Playoffs for the first time.

The club's roster features multiple senior internationals, including U.S. Women's National Team members Savannah DeMelo, Taylor Flint and Emma Sears.

Bev Yanez **HEAD COACH**

Beverly "Bev" Goebel Yanez returns for a third season as the head coach of Racing Louisville FC in 2026. Racing Louisville appointed Yanez as the club's third permanent head coach in November 2023, and she led the club to its first appearance in the NWSL Playoffs in 2025 with a seventh-place finish.

The 2025 team set club records for: wins (10), points (37), goals scored (36) and road victories (5). It finished in seventh place, its highest-ever league standing, earning the first playoff berth in Racing's history. In making the postseason, Yanez became the first person to reach the NWSL Playoffs as both a player and a coach. She was also the first American female coach to make the postseason since 2013. Yanez was named NWSL Coach of the Year, becoming the first American and first former NWSL player to win the award.

In her first season at the helm in 2024, Yanez led Racing to its most wins in a single season (7), its highest-scoring regular season (33 goals) and its most-ever points in the standings (28), narrowly missing the playoffs.

Yanez has led the development a new generation of Racing stars, notably Emma Sears. The former Ohio State forward was the final selection of the second round of the 2024 NWSL draft but but has emerged as a national star, earning regular call ups to the U.S. Women's National Team.

Following Yanez's 10-year professional career, the 36-year-old spent three years in the NWSL as an assistant coach before becoming taking charge of Racing. She spent two seasons with NJ/NY Gotham FC, where she helped lead a run to the 2021 Challenge Cup final and the 2021 NWSL Playoffs. Yanez then moved to Louisville, where she helped Racing reach the 2023 UGK NWSL Challenge Cup final — the club's first appearance in an NWSL final.



Mitch Sowerby **ASSISTANT COACH**

Sowerby moved to Racing ahead of the 2024 season after posting a 46-23-11 mark in four years as a collegiate head coach. At Oklahoma Christian, Sowerby's team posted a 10-win turnaround between his first and second seasons, earning a spot in the Division II Lone Star Conference championship in 2022.

He comes to Racing with experience across multiple levels of the sport. In addition to his college coaching work, he served as the academy director at Edmond Soccer Club

in the greater Oklahoma City area. He was the camp director for Nike Soccer Camps in Oklahoma City.

He was an assistant coach for three years at his alma mater, Division II program Rogers State University, following his collegiate career. As a player, Sowerby was a three-time all-conference player who registered more minutes than any other non-goalskeeper in Rogers State program history.



Sergio Gonzalez **GOALKEEPERS COACH**

Gonzalez joined Racing in 2021 after a stint as Indiana University's women's associate head coach. He boasts more than two decades of coaching experience, including additional collegiate stops at Dayton, Slippery Rock, NJIT and Ohio State. Internationally, he has also coached goalkeepers for the U-16 and U-17 national teams.

In his time at Racing, Gonzalez has developed the club into one of the top goalkeeper development programs in the NWSL. He coached Michelle Betos, the club's first No.

1, to a standout year, with the veteran goalkeeper finishing second in the league in saves, with 95. Gonzalez has worked closely with Racing goalkeeper Katie Lund since the club's inception and Lund's selection in the 2020 NWSL Expansion Draft. In two-plus years as Racing's starter, Lund has been among the league's top goalies, with 12 clean sheets and 214 saves. She was named to the 2023 UGK NWSL Challenge Cup All-Tournament Team.



Kiley Polk **ASSISTANT COACH**

Polk joins the Racing first team staff in 2026 after joining the Racing Louisville Academy in 2022.

Polk began her coaching career with the LouCity and Racing Academy in 2020, working part-time as a U8-U10 coach on both the boys and girls sides. She worked her way up the ladder, first as the U8-U10 director and assistant director at the Racing Academy's Oldham County branch, before eventually moving to the main academy office in 2024.



Charlie Tuley **VIDEO ANALYST**
