## Seattle Reign FC Defender Sofia Huerta Named to NWSL Best XI of the Month, Presented by Amazon Prime

Seattle Reign FC defender Sofia Huerta was named to the NWSL Best XI of the Month, presented by Amazon Prime, in March following a strong start to the 2026 season. The recognition marks the 10th Best XI selection of her career and her third in four opportunities since returning from loan with Olympique Lyonnais in August 2025.

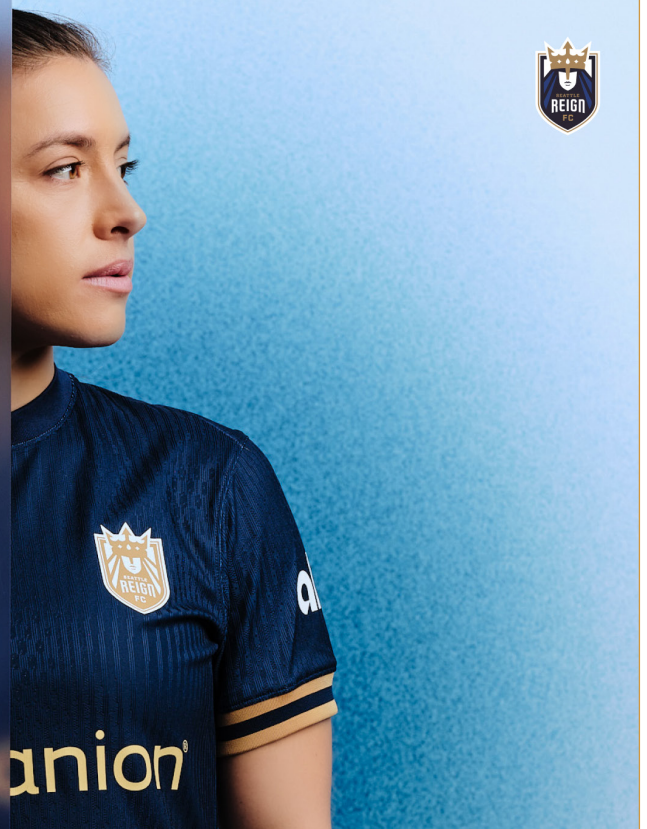
Huerta was central to Seattle's early-season success on both sides of the ball. She helped the club collect nine points from its first four matches while contributing in key attacking moments. A consistent presence in the lineup, the co-captain played every minute during a condensed 14-day stretch throughout March, including a cross-country trip to Orlando.

Her all-around impact was on full display in the club's first-ever match at ONE Spokane Stadium, where she recorded two assists in a 3-0 win over the defending NWSL Shield winners. The performance marked her first multi-assist game since 2021 and extended her league-record total to 34 career assists.

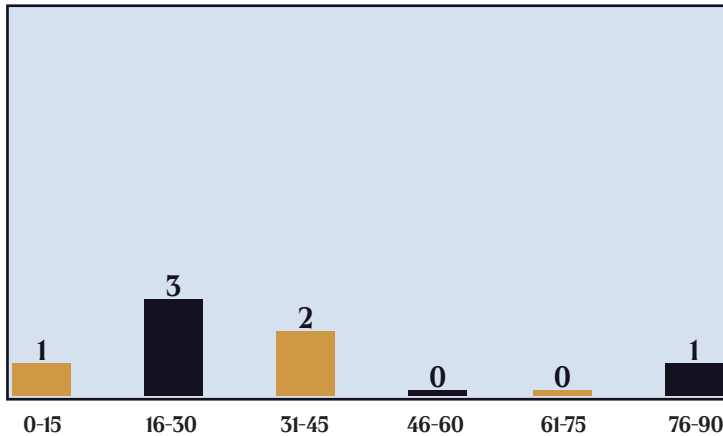

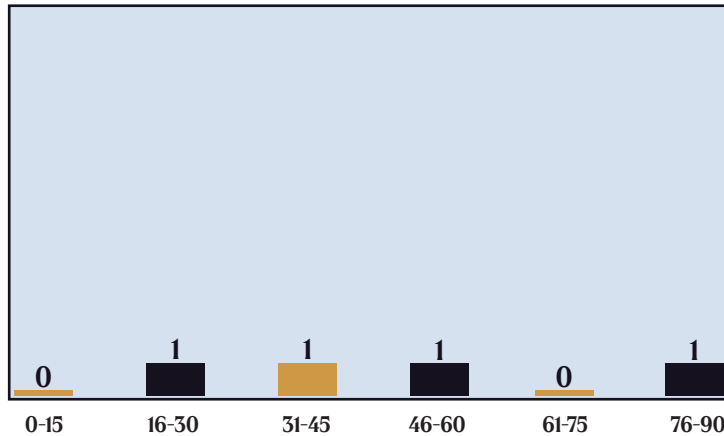

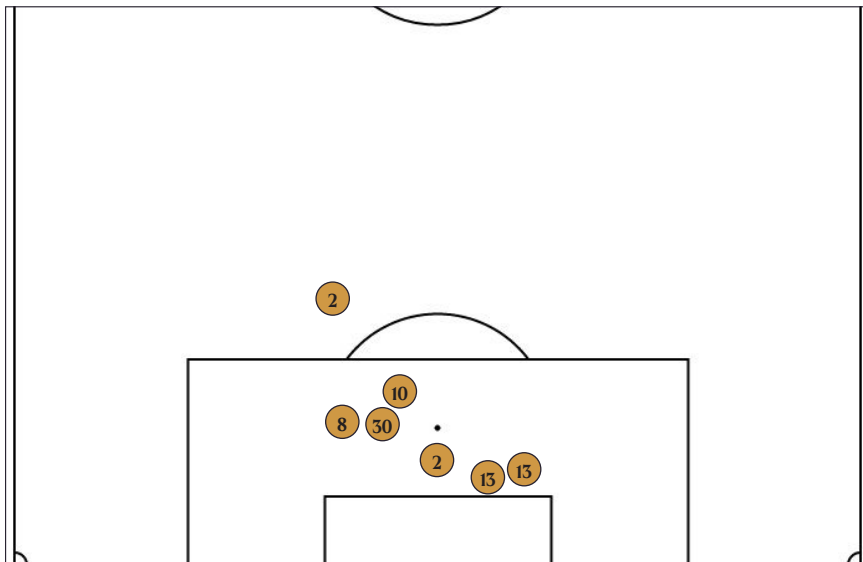

# LESLE GALLIMORE

GENERAL MANAGER

EXPERIENCE



**LESLE GALLIMORE** was named General Manager of Seattle Reign FC on May 31, 2023, overseeing all areas of the club's first team operations. In her first season with Reign FC, the club advanced to the 2023 NWSL Championship.

Gallimore previously served as Commissioner of the Girls Academy (GA) beginning in June 2020, when the development program was first formed. Under Gallimore's leadership, GA became the leading youth development platform for female soccer players throughout the United States. In the first three years of existence, GA developed over 13,000 female athletes in 91 clubs, making an immediate impact towards the growth of the sport in the U.S. Additionally, within the first two years of the GA league's official launch, over 600 players committed to continue their soccer journey at the collegiate level.

Rooted in the Pacific Northwest, Gallimore spent 26 seasons with the University of Washington women's soccer team as the second head coach in program history. From 1994-2019, the former Husky coach won 270 games, made 15 NCAA Tournament appearances, broke numerous records and twice earned Pac-12 Coach of the Year awards (2000 and 2019), becoming one of only five Pac-12 coaches ever to do so. Gallimore worked with several active Reign players, both internationally and collegiately. During her time with the Huskies, Gallimore recruited fourth-year Reign FC defender Shae Holmes and has also worked with former Reign FC defender Lauren Barnes during her coaching tenure with the U.S. U-23 Women's National Team.

Following her coaching career at Washington, Gallimore was inducted into the Washington Youth Soccer Hall of Fame in 2019 in recognition for over 20 years of excellence coaching players on and off the field, joining Seattle Reign Academy Executive Director, Amy Griffin, in this honor.

In 2024, United Soccer Coaches announced Gallimore as the 85th recipient of its Honor Award, recognizing her remarkable service to the association and exceptional contributions to soccer across all levels of the game. Gallimore officially received the award during the annual Awards Ceremony on January 10, 2025 at the United Soccer Coaches Convention in Chicago, IL. Gallimore became the third woman to ever receive this award. In 2018, she spent a year as the President of the United Soccer Coaches organization. The organization was created with the mission of inspiring coaches and igniting their passion for the game, passing it on to players and others in the soccer community. Continuing her mentorship, she has also been involved in the Empowering Women and Girls through the Sports Diplomacy Program through the U.S. State Department, traveling to Morocco, Ethiopia and Israel all in efforts to support and empower women and girls.

As an inspirational leader, Gallimore was named the first-ever recipient of the Carla Overbeck Leadership Award by U.S. Soccer in March 2023. The honor is given to an individual who demonstrates a unique ability to lead and guide others and who contributes to the success of an initiative that benefits those outside their own organization and places emphasis on collaboration within and among leadership.

A lifelong steward of the game, Gallimore is a coaching mentor as part of U.S. Soccer's SheChampions Mentorship Program. The program seeks to inspire the next generation of female players and coaches through critical representation in the sport. Many notable coaches have participated in this program, including Head Coach Laura Harvey.

In 2016, Gallimore was the first community leader to be honored in the Reign's Legends Campaign. The longtime Reign supporter also broadcasted some of the Reign's matches when the team played at Memorial Stadium.

**LAURA HARVEY** was named the head coach of Seattle Reign FC on July 15, 2021, after previously serving as the club's first-ever head coach for five consecutive seasons (2013-17). Prior to the 2026 season, Harvey signed a multi-year contract extension on January 13, 2026 to remain in Seattle through the 2028 NWSL season.

Harvey, the winningest head coach in NWSL history, enters her 11th season with Reign FC, having led the club to three NWSL Shields, which is also an all-time record among NWSL head coaches, and three NWSL Championship appearances (2014, 2015, 2023). Harvey holds an all-time NWSL regular season record of **116 wins, 87 losses and 67 draws**. On August 25, 2024, Harvey became the first coach in NWSL history to win 100 regular season games after the club defeated the North Carolina Courage 1-0.

Another addition to her list of records, Harvey is a three-time NWSL Coach of the Year (2014, 2015, 2021), the most selections in league history. Harvey is also the first NWSL head coach to win the award on back-to-back occasions. She has led the club to six appearances in the NWSL Playoffs (2014-15, 2021-23, 2025).

Harvey helped Seattle return to the NWSL Playoffs in 2025 after missing it the previous year, which snapped a five-time streak for the club. Throughout the 2025 campaign, Reign FC was just one of four teams to remain in the playoff picture (top 8 teams) all season long.

In 2023, Harvey became the first coach in NWSL history to reach 200 regular season games coached. Despite sending the most players in the NWSL to the 2023 FIFA Women's World Cup, she was able to lead the Reign to the No. 1 overall seed of the Challenge Cup. Following the season, Harvey was named 2023 Seattle Sports Leader of the Year, presented by the Seattle Sports Commission Foundation.

The 2022 regular season ended with a seven-game unbeaten streak for Seattle, including three consecutive games on the road that all resulted in wins to help the Reign finish the season with a league-best 40 points and secure its third NWSL Shield. Harvey was named a finalist for NWSL Coach of the Year, her second-consecutive nomination. Throughout the 22-game regular season, Harvey listed 21 different starting XIs as she balanced a busy and challenging schedule that featured up to a league-high nine players being called up for international duty on several



occasions and an appearance in The Women's Cup. On August 20, 2022, the Reign claimed the second-ever Women's Cup title after defeating Club América in the semifinals and Racing Louisville FC, the defending champions of the tournament, in the final, due to Harvey's ability to strategically utilize the club's depth throughout the tournament.

Joining Seattle midway through the 2021 season, Harvey managed the club to an eight-game unbeaten streak spanning from August 21 to October 16, allowing the Reign to host a playoff match for the first time since 2015. For all her work throughout the 2021 season, Harvey was named the 2021 NWSL Coach of the Year.

Prior to returning to the Reign and the NWSL, Harvey signed with U.S. Soccer as the Under-20 Women's National Team head coach in January 2020, where she led the U-20s through a seven-game unbeaten run at the 2020 Concacaf Women's U-20 Championship in the Dominican Republic to capture the title. Harvey also served as an assistant coach for the U.S. Women's National Team during the 2020 Olympic Games in Tokyo.

On November 17, 2017, the Utah Royals, in their first run as an expansion club, announced Harvey as the club's first-ever head coach, where she took on a new challenge and fulfilled the role for the inaugural season in 2018 and the following season in 2019. Harvey worked closely in Utah with Scott Parkinson, the Reign's head assistant coach, where he also served as an assistant coach under Harvey.

Before making the move to Utah, the three-time NWSL Coach of the Year was the Reign's first-ever head coach and led the club for five consecutive seasons. From 2013 to 2017, Harvey finished with a regular season record of 51 wins, 33 losses and 26 draws, a .464 winning percentage over 110 regular-season games with the Reign. She led the club to consecutive NWSL Shields and NWSL Championship appearances in 2014 and 2015. Harvey was the first head coach in the league to reach milestones of 200 matches coached and 100 matches coached, as well as the first to notch 100 wins and 50 wins.

Despite a difficult first season in 2013 for the club on the field, Harvey was building a culture of leadership, hard work, and positivity, which quickly began to translate over to on-field success. In 2014, the Reign finished with a league-high 54 points, which is currently the biggest turnaround between seasons in NWSL history, as the club finished with 36 more points than they tallied in 2013. The immediate turnaround helped the club reach its first-ever NWSL Championship appearance and earned Harvey her first selection as NWSL Coach of the Year. The following season,



the club continued to excel by recording a league-high 43 points, winning back-to-back NWSL Shields and appearing in back-to-back NWSL Championships. Despite not making the NWSL Playoffs in 2016 and 2017, the club finished fifth in the league in both seasons, falling short of the playoffs by one position.

Under Harvey's leadership, she helped her players earn a combined 34 NWSL Best XI First Team and Second Team selections among 17 different players. The winningest head coach in league history also helped two players earn the title of NWSL Most Valuable Player: midfielder Kim Little (2014) and midfielder Jess Fishlock (2021). Harvey also coached defender Lauren Barnes when she earned NWSL Defender of the Year in 2016.

Born on May 15, 1980, Harvey is originally from Bulkington, a village in Warwickshire, England. She attended George Eliot School in Nuneaton and played football for the Coventry City L.F.C. At the age of 22, she began her coaching career after tearing her ACL while playing for Birmingham City L.F.C. Harvey holds a USSF A Coaching License and a UEFA A Coaching License. She earned her BA in Sports Studies at the University of Wolverhampton in 2001 and her BTEC (Business and Technology Education Council) National Diploma in Sport from Henley College in 1998.

Head Coach Laura Harvey, the winningest coach in NWSL history, has 116 regular season wins all-time. Over the span of two seasons with the Royals, between 2018 and 2019, Harvey won 19 games. With the Reign (2013-17 and 2021-present), Harvey has 97 total wins. Among all of her NWSL wins, she has defeated the Houston Dash the most in her career, with 17 total victories.

With 15+ years of coaching experience in the United States, Parkinson was hired as the Head Assistant Coach of Seattle Reign FC on January 10, 2023. Prior to joining Reign FC, Parkinson was named Head Coach of Gotham FC midway through the 2021 season, leading the team to the 2021 NWSL playoffs for the first time since 2013. Prior to Gotham, he served as an Assistant Coach for the Chicago Red Stars until August 2021.

Parkinson had his first stint with Head Coach Laura Harvey for two seasons at the Utah Royals in 2018 and 2019, where he initially made his NWSL start as an Assistant Coach under Harvey. Together, the two helped guide the Royals to 19 wins in two years. Parkinson later served as Utah's Head Coach through the 2020 NWSL Draft. The Liverpool, England native holds a USSF Pro coaching license, in addition to USSF A and UEFA B licenses.



## LEE NGUYEN (he/him)

Entering his sixth season in the NWSL and second with Reign FC, Nguyen serves as an Assistant Coach. Prior to joining Harvey's staff in 2025, he spent the 2024 season with Angel City FC as an Assistant Coach. ## KATE NORTON (she/her)

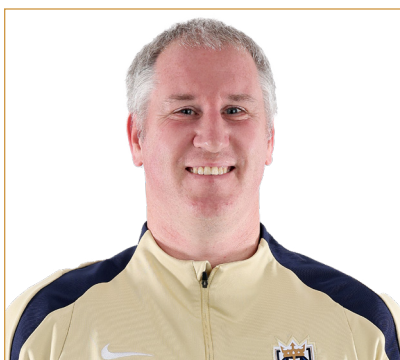

# SEATTLE REIGN FC CLUB HISTORY

**S**eattle Reign FC, one of the eight inaugural members of the National Women's Soccer League, was founded in 2012 by owners Bill and Teresa Predmore. The club played its first season at Starfire Stadium in Tukwila, Washington, before moving to Memorial Stadium in Seattle in 2014. The club won consecutive NWSL Shields in 2014 and 2015 after finishing at the top of the table both seasons. Head Coach Laura Harvey was named the NWSL Coach of the Year for the 2014 and 2015 seasons. The club missed the playoffs in 2016 and 2017, before returning in 2018, in its first season under head coach Vlatko Andonovski.

On January 30, 2019, the Reign announced that it would begin playing its home matches at Cheney Stadium in Tacoma, Washington. The club reached the NWSL semifinals for a second consecutive season in 2019, before Andonovski departed the club to accept the head coaching position with the U.S. Women's National Team. In November of 2019, it was announced that the Predmores had entered into exclusive negotiations to sell the club to OL Groupe, the parent company of Olympique Lyonnais. The sale was announced on December 19, 2019, with OL Groupe becoming 89.5% owners, the Predmores retaining a 7.5% stake and four-time NBA champion Tony Parker holding a 3.0% stake. In March 2020, the club officially unveiled its new name and crest ahead of the 2020 season - OL Reign.

In 2021, the Reign played its first game at Lumen Field in Seattle, Washington, as part of a first-of-its-kind doubleheader event in partnership with Seattle Sounders FC. Following that event and an inspiring comeback season led by Harvey and Assistant Coach Sam Laity, the team finished in second place in the NWSL standings and competed in an NWSL semifinal match. It was then announced in December 2021 that the team would be making Lumen Field its new home stadium beginning in 2022. Club founders Bill and Teresa Predmore announced prior to the start of the 2022 NWSL season that they would be stepping away from the club in an operating capacity and former Chief Operating Officer, Vincent Berthillot, was appointed CEO.

The Reign played its first-ever regular-season home game at Lumen Field on May 8, 2022. The club went on to break its attendance record on four different occasions throughout the 2022 season, setting the new record at 21,491 fans during the NWSL semifinal against the Kansas City Current on October 23, 2022. The club drew an attendance record of 10,746 fans during its final match of the regular season on October 1 - the same match Reign FC secured its third NWSL Shield for finishing first in the league. At the end of the 2022 NWSL season, Reign FC announced Starfire Sports Complex in Tukwila, WA as its new training facility, just 12 miles away from the club's home stadium.

In April 2023, it was announced that the club was for sale by OL Groupe. The 2023 season featured an all-time league attendance record set by the Reign in the final match of the regular season at Lumen Field when 34,130 fans attended the club's Forever Reign: A Celebration of Megan Rapinoe match. That match also set the league record for broadcast viewership during a regular season game. After finishing the season in fourth place, the Reign advanced through the quarterfinal and semifinal to reach the NWSL Championship for the first time since 2015. On January 9, 2024, it was announced that the Reign would be returning to its roots and rebranding as Seattle Reign FC. This rebrand saw the return of the original crest from 2013, in a refreshed color palette to symbolize the club's historical success.

On June 17, 2024, it was announced that the Ownership Group of Seattle Sounders FC and global investment firm Carlyle joined together to invest in and operate Seattle Reign FC. The blockbuster agreement united the topflight teams in women's and men's professional soccer for the first time in Seattle history, keeping the club firmly rooted in the Pacific Northwest for generations of fans.

## PRIMARY

### REFLECTION

The primary kit, **Reflection**, launched in 2024 and was designed to showcase the core values of Seattle Reign FC. The name originates from the club's progression over the last 13 years, while reflecting on the journey embraced to get there. The kit is a reflection, both past and present, of coaches, players and staff who have helped write and tell the story of Seattle Reign FC. It's also a reflection of Seattle and the communities and supporters who have proudly represented the club for over a decade. The strength of color embodies the strength that this club has carried since the inaugural season in 2013. With gold accents to crown the regal kit, the team makes its triumphant return to its roots. Reign FC takes a moment to reflect on its past, as done in the rebrand, but forge a new and brighter golden future.



## SECONDARY

### RISE



**Rise**, the Reign's secondary kit launched in 2025, was named for the club's forward momentum and vision for success and impact on and off the pitch. The kit was designed and inspired by the iconic landmarks and massive monuments across Seattle, offering a unique perspective that inspires players, fans and the entire community to look up, rise up and strive for greatness. Featuring a modern interpretation of Reign FC's signature colors, the kit includes flowing golden rays that capture strength, integrity and structure of Seattle's architectural brilliance found in the city's skyline. The colors and textures also mirror the Pacific Northwest sun rising over the Cascades, illuminating the beauty of the Salish Sea and the Olympic Mountains. The Rise Kit is completed with diffused blue trims and shorts, a color that is one-of-a-kind to Reign FC.

## THIRD

### SURGE

The Reign's third kit, **Surge**, launched ahead of the 2026 season and represents legacy in motion - honoring the foundation built across generations while rising confidently into the club's next chapter. Rooted in Deep Concord Blue, the design reflects the identity and permanence that have defined the club from the beginning. Royal Pulse introduces the energy of what's next, while Volt accents spark the moment where past and future meet, nodding to iconic Reign kits of years past. Inspired by the force and flow of the Pacific Northwest, fluid graphic elements evoke resilience, strength and momentum. The Surge Kit is a bold expression of who Reign FC has been and who it is becoming - proud of its roots, confident in its direction and ready to move forward.

## 2026 MEDIA POLICY

The Seattle Reign FC Communications Department has put together the 2026 Media Policy to assist you in covering the Reign throughout the 2026 NWSL season. This policy is for media information only; not for distribution.

### General Training Policy

- New for 2026, as part of the club's ongoing commitment to expanded media access, working members of the press are invited to attend any of the training sessions noted in the team's schedule each week.
- Video and still photography may be shot throughout all training sessions, but a member of Reign FC Communications will advise media when the shooting period is over. At that time, all cameras must be shut off and removed from their tripods.
- Media must remain on the sidelines at all times during the team stretch and individual periods. At the direction of the Communications team, additional shooting locations may be available during training.
- Video and/or still photography of players' on-field rehab are not permitted at any time.
- Members of the media are not permitted to talk to players or coaches during practice.
- All texts and social posts must be in accordance with the reporting guidelines below - specifically to player availability, credentialed media are strongly encouraged to wait for a post-training update from a member of the coaching staff prior to reporting on any player availability.

### Reporting Guidelines

- May report non-strategy and non-game plan observations.
- May report which players are/are not practicing during the open period. For players not practicing, may only report they are not practicing and, if applicable, "working off to the side."
- May NOT report or shoot video/stills of anything related to injured players and their rehab.
- No reporting of specific set piece structure, all other generalities (pass, run, shoot, etc.) are permitted.
- All cell phones must be turned to 'silent' or 'vibrate' mode.

### Matchday

- Media are not permitted to talk to coaches and players during pregame warm-ups, halftime and throughout the match.
- Unless otherwise prearranged through Reign FC Communications, video and photos of coaches and players are NOT allowed outside of the locker room/press conference room, this includes the concourse between the locker room/press room.
- Media members should refer to the policy on their credential and direct any questions to a representative of Reign FC.

### Additional

- All interview requests for technical staff/front office personnel, including General Manager Lesle Gallimore, must be made through the Reign FC Communications Department.
- General Manager Lesle Gallimore and assistant coaches are not available immediately following games.
- The team's athletic training staff and doctors are NOT available for media interviews.
- A player who suffers a concussion or serious injury in a game is NOT available to the media in a postgame press conference. This extends during the practice week until the player has been cleared by the medical team.

### NWSL Policy on Credentialed Media

The following actions may result in seizure of credential and/or ejection of its wearer from the stadium or training facility:

- Requesting autographs at any time
- Taking photographs with players/coaches
- Using credential for family or friends of a working media member
- Conduction of unauthorized interviews
- Unprofessional behavior (cheering in the press box, consumption of alcoholic beverages, failure to abide by posted rules)
